Why a Mission Board?

There is much debate about the need and place of a mission agency. Let me say that if a local church can adequately take care of the needs of a missionary on the field, then the mission agency is not needed. With that said, most churches are not able to nor is it sustainable for a church to handle all that is

involved with missionary care and accountability.

A Mission Board is an arm of the local church, not a replacement of the local church. It is much like a camp ministry, a Bible school, or other ministries that enhance and help the local church. BMFP does not send missionaries to the mission field, that is the responsibility of the local church. We are here to assist and aid the local church in its pursuit of the Great Commission. A mission board that has its biblical place works directly with the local church and does not usurp authority over its missionary. We provide "watch-care" over the missionary as we work alongside the local church.

We believe we should minister to the missionary and their family but we also have a responsibility to minister to and encourage sending church pastors. BMFP strives to build and establish closer relationships with our missionaries and their sending churches. This is a work in progress. We are still learning how we can best accomplish this goal. Over the last few years, the Lord has allowed us to build relationships with some very dear churches and their pastors. The care of the Lord's servants is a very high priority. Missionaries and their sending churches are not just a number to be counted but a family to be served, saluted, and strengthened.

If you are or have a potential missionary candidate, we would be honored if you would consider partnering with BMFP. Reaching the world with the Gospel is a task that can be accomplished as we work together for the cause of Christ. When the Covid 19 pandemic hit, Dr. Burge incorporated the Zoom technology to facilitate communication throughout the BMFP Family. He instituted the weekday 9:00 a.m. Zoom prayer meetings with the BMFP Field Administrators. These times of fellowship and prayer have elevated our relationship with the Lord and one another exponentially.

The number of field administrators who are able to get on varies from 2 to 10, depending on schedules. Regardless of where we are in the world, if we can get online, we are there. Technology gives, "Where two or three are gathered together in my name," a whole other dimension! The number of prayer requests that come in weekly varies as well. This week there are 19 requests. It is sometimes hard to get through praying for each of the requests in less than an hour. "Sweet Hour of Prayer" is a precious reality.

Dr. Burge would often say, "BMFP does not send missionaries to the mission field. That is the job of the local church. BMFP exists to assist the local churches in their pursuit of the fulfillment of the Great Commission." He would say, "BMFP does not belong to me. BMFP belongs to the Lord." The implications and ramifications of these statements place the role and ministry of prayer in a proper andvital perspective. This is the perspective: Jesus is the Head of His Church.
