Dear Pastors, Church Families, and Praying Friends,

It's been a blessing to be home for a month straight! We've been able to participate in several functions at our home church this month. In the photo below, our friend Charity is helping me clean up the pot from the corn boil we enjoyed as part of a Leadership fellowship early this month. When we are not traveling, I work as the Administrative Assistant here at GRBC. This role encompasses a wide variety of tasks, from traditional office duties, to building maintenance like the outdoor spigot replacement shown below. Since the camper has been parked for a bit, and the weather has permitted, we've taken time to further diagnose and repair a mysterious and frustrating roof leak (pictured below). The advantage of an RV is that you travel with your own hotel room, but the disadvantage is the almost seemingly constant maintenance. Even so, we praise God for His provision of the temporary use of this RV at no cost to us, and the opportunity to be a blessing in return to the generous owner by making these necessary repairs!

A missions board or agency provides vital services for a local church that is sending out a missionary! They can provide logistical, administrative, legal, and other support for which many local churches simply aren't equipped, as well as an additional level of accountability for the missionary. This month, we officially began the process of applying to World Wide New Testament Baptist Missions as our missions agency. This is a process that will take some time, as there is a significant amount of paperwork to be filled out (including a number of reference forms from various facets of our life), as well as a lengthy interview once the forms have all been turned in. We've been able to work alongside missionaries from this agency in the past, and we're very excited about the potential to work with WWNTBM in a more official capacity!

Finally, we are excited to share with you many of the ways God has blessed through the lengthy repairs of our new-to-us truck! I delayed the delivery of this letter in order to share this praise. Though there were some opportunities for frustration when we considered this situation through the lens of our own timing, we know that God's timing is always perfect! The short version is that since the end of June when the truck was delivered, it has spent a significant time in two different dealerships having the engine and transmission replaced, as well as a few other necessary repairs. While the engine and transmission are both rebuilds, they are in much better condition than the ones it came with, and these repairs will lengthen the duration for which this truck will serve us, as well as decrease potential repair costs over that time! While the truck was in the shop, we still had our old truck, and when we needed to tow the trailer, we used rentals. In God's goodness, He ensured that we never paid a dime for any of the repairs or rentals! For sake of space, I had to leave out many details of His blessing, but neither Angela or I get tired of bragging on God, so feel free to ask us in person!

In October, we will be traveling to central Illinois to work with Bible Tracts, Inc. for their annual Open House event. In the latter part of the month, we'll be traveling to Virginia for a missions conference. Please pray for safety as we travel. Pray that the roof leak on the trailer is finally resolved. Pray for BTI and their important work, which we'll talk more about in our next letter. Pray for the services at the missions conference. Pray for opportunities to share the Gospel with those we encounter as we travel!
