Dear friends,

Thank you for your continued prayers and support for the work here on Malaita, Solomon Islands. The emphasis on planting an indigenous church here that can sustain itself is always at the forefront of our ministry goals. I am excited to report that for the last four months, the church has been able to pay the rent from regular tithes and offerings alone. This is particularly exciting because it demonstrates personal ownership amongst the people as well as personal obedience in giving. We still have far to go with discipleship and training, but this is an encouraging sign for me personally and I hope you can rejoice with us in this accomplishment.



Several men have continued to take responsibility for various ministries here such as song leading and organizing the Sunday service and another man has continued teaching each week for youth night. One family recently asked if they could begin hosting a midweek Bible study in their home to reach their neighbors for Christ—we'll start that next week. Please pray for fruit from these efforts.

Melodie has continued to have opportunities with her medical work to not only aid people physically, but share Christ with those in need. Pray that she can see fruit from her labour with her patients.

The past several months in the church have brought both encouragement and challenges. We're grateful for those who remain faithful, yet we continue to grieve over some families still bound by sin.

Please pray that God would deliver and transform those who are lost.

The house construction is steadily continuing. Our current lease will expire at the end of August and we are needing to move into the house by then. The septic should be done soon as well as some of the walls. We plan to move in at the end of August and just progressively finish things as we are able to. We are still in need of about \$18,000 to finish. We are confident that the funding will arrive in God's timing.

The kids are doing well. We had a bit of a health scare with Lottie a week ago. She woke up around 3 a.m. breathing very poorly. Melodie took her to the hospital and it was confirmed that she had pneumonia. After several days of antibiotics and lots of care from Melodie, she seems much better.

It is the privilege of a lifetime to serve the Lord here on Malaita and we are grateful to all of you who have partnered with us as we work to evangelize and make disciples for Christ on this side of the world.
