Dear Pastor and praying friends,

It is hard to believe that in just a few weeks we will have been in South America for a year. We are in the final stretch of our language school and realize we still have much to learn in day-to-day conversation. The Lord has given us the opportunity to participate in evangelism and me the opportunity the past couple months to preach in three different churches, in Spanish, which was quite a challenge. Everyone has been kind and complimentary, but I realize I still have so much more to learn. We're not looking to become eloquent necessarily, but we are looking to become effective at witnessing and understanding where people are when we discuss spiritual things.

The Lord has also given us the opportunity to witness to some of the people at our language school. Many of them speak very little English so it has been good for us to discuss spiritual things with them in Spanish. We've had the opportunity to witness to our drivers, waiters, instructors and other people in our day-to-day interactions. We have seen some visitors at church, but not as many as we would like. In that regard, it is very similar to witnessing in the States. People tell us they will be there, but then we never see them. We just have to be faithful and continue to pray, witness, and encourage them to visit the church. Even though many here do not practice their Catholic faith, it is sad that it has turned them against "religion" in general. We just try to share with people that it is about a relationship that is personal with Jesus Christ and the authority of His Word - not the authority of an institution or a priest.

As we near the end of our official language studies, our educational visas will soon be expiring. We have mentioned this request before and are asking continued prayer for the visa process. We are hoping we can be sponsored in by one of the fundamental churches here in Colombia on a religious visa. The time frame of the visa varies based on whoever reviews our application, not necessarily on any fixed guidelines. So we are just asking for specific prayer that the Lord gives us two or three years on this with the renewed visa. We ask continued prayer for those that we have witnessed to and have seen come to church. It is heartbreaking that religion itself blinds the eyes of the lost to the truth and simplicity of the gospel.

Please know that we faithfully pray for each of our supporting churches and the condition of our country as well. Being in a foreign country has greatly increased our burden and desire to see a revival and return to Christ in our own land. To whom much is given much is required. We want to thank each and every one of you again for the prayers, the support, the extra gifts for birthdays and during the Christmas season. Your care and thoughtfulness is not overlooked and is greatly appreciated.
