Greetings in the lovely name of our risen Savior, Jesus Christ. We hope and pray this finds you faithful as you labor in the place that the Lord has put you to fulfill your part of the Great Commission.

We are so very thankful that in spite of the various trials and opposition we often face, we are still able to enjoy seeing the Lord working in the hearts and lives of men, women, and children here in Papua New Guinea.

Special Meetings: At the end of August, we held a 3-day meeting to dedicate our new tent for the gospel ministry here in Papua New Guinea. The final day of the meeting, we broke up into various groups under the tent to pray for our country here and for doors to open for us to take the gospel throughout. It was a great time of prayer, followed by a great time of food and fellowship with a traditional “Mumu” (pig roast). **Please pray as we continue to plan and prepare to take the tent to various areas here to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ.**

Also, last week (the final week of October), I was honored to be asked to be one of the speakers for the annual National Pastors Conference. Every year, this meeting hosts hundreds of Baptist pastors and preachers from all over the country. This meeting is always a great time of fellowship with wonderful preaching and singing. I was blessed to preach 3 times on the topic of Biblical leadership and was encouraged by the great response to what was said.

Upcoming Meetings: In December, we have 2 tent meetings scheduled, and we ask that you pray for God to work in these. **The first week of December, we will be going to an area (Kondopina) where one of our graduating Bible School students has been laboring for some years to establish a church.** He asked me to come and help him by preaching and baptizing him and many of his new converts there. Although he was saved about 8 years ago, he has never been baptized. He asked me to come and help him with this before Bible School graduation, and I have happily agreed.

Also, at the end of the year, we are planning to hold a tent meeting in Kelua close to our new church location. The local primary school where we are currently teaching CCVE classes to the students, has already agreed to allow us to put the tent on their campus in order to give a neutral place in the middle of this large community for everyone to be able to come and hear God's word.

Kelua Ministry: Please continue to pray for the work in Kelua. **On October 19th, we began holding Sunday Morning services in Kelua as Open Bible Baptist Church.** Even though our property has not been developed yet, and a meeting house still needs to be built, we are thrilled to launch this next chapter of the work in Kelua. Currently, we are meeting in a borrowed classroom at one of the local schools until we can transition over to this new property. Please pray that we can make this move sometime in the month of November as we plan to further establish the church and baptize many of our new Christians around the beginning of December.

In our last letter, I asked you to pray specifically for the children and young people in Kelua. It seems that these prayers were not in vain, as 11 teenagers made the decision to call upon the Lord to save them in the last 2 months! These young people have been faithful to services and have very quickly found their place to serve in the church, many of them inviting their friends and family to come. **Please continue to pray as many of the parents of these young people are still unsaved.**

Also, a teacher at the local school, William, and his wife, Cathy, have started coming to our services a few weeks ago. They were saved at another Baptist Church in the capital city, but when he was transferred to Kelua to teach, they allowed themselves to backslide a bit and stopped attending church altogether. The Lord has been working on William recently and it is a blessing to see him get involved in our new church in Kelua.

Of course, these great blessings in Kelua are not without opposition. **As I write this, Kelua is literally in the middle of a war between 2 of the clans that live at the road junction where our church property is located.** It is local election time, and this has caused much unrest and violence to come up in recent days. Some men have been cut by machetes, others have been shot, and quite a few have suffered property damage and loss. Some people are in very critical condition as we speak, and the entire community is tense and under fear.

One of our new Christians, Paul, (who I mentioned in a previous letter), was a victim of this violence when his house and all his belongings were burned(including his Bible). **Please pray for the gospel to penetrate this place and bring true peace to the lives and souls of these people, and please pray for the believers to show forth Christ to all involved in this conflict.**

I have paid visits to both sides of the fight to pray with them and provide them Biblical counsel. I was welcomed by both groups and informed that the door was open to come back. **Please pray for this door to remain open and for the Lord to provide wisdom to all those involved in order to prevent further bloodshed and the perishing of lost souls.**

Lastly, thank you to all of you have contributed towards the purchase of our new truck to be used to transport people to services, our tent to various meetings, and other materials for ministry projects. We have almost enough funds to purchase a barely used, or even a new vehicle. We ask that you pray for the Lord to guide us as we seek to purchase the best vehicle for this work. Used vehicles in Papua New Guinea often come with a long list of issues, but new ones can many times be overpriced. Your prayers are greatly appreciated as we seek to make this purchase before the end of the year.
