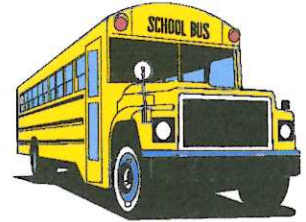




Keep the Buses Rolling
