Dear partners in the Gospel,

With gratefulness, I send you this second-trimester update of 2026, updating you on the "furtherance of the Gospel" here in Mexico (Phil. 1:12).

Biblical Counseling outreach...now and toward the future:

When we arrived in San Luis Potosí, my first burden was to reach out to addicts and their families through "Hope Group" meetings. Yet, it dawned on me that if I had to start a ministry to the addicted all over again, there was one thing I would have done differently way back in 2021; start a full marriage and family ministry first, all because of the familial carnage that addiction brings with it.

Praise to God, here in San Luis, we have the vision to begin Hope Group later this year in September, but also have an amazing group of about 40 solid married couples in our new church here. So, to lay the groundwork, we began training them to open their homes and use our "Connected Marriage" material as an outreach, but also with the eye toward September and meeting even more needs when the addicts come, Lord willing.

Praise to God for His blessings on the work we left behind in Puebla:



"Iglesia Bautista Esperanza Viva" in Puebla has called Bro. Julio Gamboa to shepherd them. He is a young man with vision, a heart for Gospel preaching, for teens and families, and comes from a church where there is an excellent training in music. He is already implementing a focus on these areas. We have spoken several times and I am aiding him as much as I can to help our beloved church in Puebla to continue growing.

With great zeal for the needy and lost, together Bro. Julio and I plan to continue the ministry of Hope Group and Hope House for Men advancing in Puebla.

Please pray for wisdom for Hope House for Ladies. It was necessary to temporarily discontinue it because our one full-time worker was called back home by her pastor and had to leave. It is very challenging to find adequate workers for a Ladies' addiction ministry more than a Men's ministry. We have found that out.

Here in San Luis, our church has a ministry similar to Hope House for Men where there are about 50 men interned. Pastor Ramos and I are praying about re-initiating Hope House for Ladies in the future, but here in San Luis, since our church does not have a ministry for women like that here. Please join us in prayer about this very important ministry.

Learning the pace at our new church:

Our family has adjusted very well to the new city and church. When we ask Hudson to pray at home, his prayer always starts the same. *"Lord, thanks for bringing us to San Luis."* Such is the sentiment of all our family. We are very grateful to serve the Lord here (and are expecting another daughter to be born in September)!

Working at such a large ministry is new for me, and the pace has been a wonderful challenge. This past trimester, I taught two classes in the Bible College, led a Men's Conference where about 220 men from our church and a few others attended, and have personally counseled a variety of people. We are also actively involved in personal evangelism on a weekly basis.

Also, Pastor Ramos asked me to lead the staff members which total about 60 full-time workers, which serve in different ministries such as our Bible College, orphanage, printing ministry, missions outreach, discipleship, music, and office staff. There were already good leaders in each of these areas, so my job is simply to lead them and create a greater synergy between all the teams. It has been a good challenge!

Thank you all for praying and giving so that we might "give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the Word" (Acts 6:4).
