Dwight L. Moody once said, "The happiest days of my life have been the days when I have been busiest in the service of God." We wholeheartedly agree. The Lord has opened several new avenues for us to serve Him in the last few months. We have been non-stop busy, but we are deeply grateful that He would choose to use us in this way!

5th Sunday Rally: The last Sunday in March brought a special evening service as we gathered with several sister churches in our area. Together, we rented a hall large enough to accommodate everyone. With more than 150 people in attendance, the service was a great blessing. Two men shared their salvation testimonies; a group of young people sang a special; a combined choir of 4 different churches, roughly 60 people, sang a hair-raising special; and two preachers faithfully proclaimed the Word of God! We are already looking forward to our next rally at the end of May.

Special Sundays: Over the past few months, we have been privileged to host a couple of special Sundays. In the beginning of March, we observed "Heaven Sunday," a day set aside to reflect on the hope we have in our heavenly home with Christ. We were blessed to have Missionary James Wyatt preach in both services.

On the last Sunday in April, Missionary Josh Sullivan was with us and preached both services. It was a convicting time for all as he shared his testimony of God's faithfulness through last year's ordeal and deeply challenged our faith in his sermon.

MES Preachers: Since July 2025, when we had to return to the USA due to visa issues, the Lord has faithfully provided preachers for an outreach ministry of SRBC. Although SRBC has several capable men, the responsibility was heavy for just a few to carry. Through God's providence, several young men from sister churches have stepped in to help. We now have a rotation of eight men who faithfully share the Word of God each week with these dear people.

Helping Hands: We have often heard it said, "God will give through you what He never intends to give to you," and we have seen that truth on a much larger scale this past month.

It began when one of our outreach ministries asked if we knew anyone who could use some extra bread. We soon discovered that "extra bread" meant 700 loaves over three days! We were able to transport and distribute the bread to those in need—a tremendous blessing.

Just a week later, we received another call about surplus fruit and vegetables that could not be stored before spoiling. Not realizing the quantity, Matthew took his SUV to collect it, only to make two additional trips and eventually fill a 12-foot trailer. Along with produce, there were also potatoes and sweet potatoes. This food was distributed to two orphanages, several families, and a soup kitchen that feeds hundreds of people five days a week. We are truly grateful for the opportunity to serve these communities in their time of need.

Youth Rally: The Friday before our 5th Sunday Rally, Grace Baptist Church hosted a combined youth rally. We brought 22 teens from our church to attend. The evening was filled with preaching, singing, and fun games. The kids LOVED the "Mystery Make Your Own Smoothies" game, which included some very interesting ingredients blended together and then drunk by different groups! Matthew had the opportunity to preach to around 100 teens that night. It was a wonderful experience, and our teens especially enjoyed meeting others from different churches. We are already planning to participate again.

Family Update: On the family side, we have enjoyed a few great family days in the last few months. One Monday after a quick morning at school, we enjoyed a great hike up Lady Slipper Mountain (you should Google it!). On a separate occasion, we also hiked down the Sacramento Trail, which winds along the edge of the Indian Ocean, offering beautiful views and steep mountain-like sections. At the end of March, we celebrated Eason's 12th birthday. (This boy is now over 5'7" and in a men's clothing and size 11 shoe, send help!) He continues to be a great blessing to both our family and our church. Over the past couple of years, he has been learning to play guitar and is always willing to serve wherever needed. In April, he (and Daddy) began learning bass guitar. Eason is a fast learner, and he has already been playing in church over the past several weeks. We are excited to see how the Lord will continue to use Eason for His glory.

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
