PASTOR'S LETTER

January 8, 2026

I hope everyone had a wonderful celebration of Christmas and the New Year. Now, the decorations are coming down, and the parties are all over. The students are back in school from break and life is returning to normal for us. However, I hope that life never goes back to "normal" for us, I hope that we have been transformed by what we have celebrated. The mystery of the Incarnation and the realization of that mystery at the Epiphany must have some impact on our lives. Our hearts must have been moved in some way. We must be striving to be just a little bit better than we were. Total conversion never happens overnight, but if we are just a little better than before, then Christmas did its job. Today, we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus Christ. Jesus leaves us this example to follow. We are brought into the body of Christ through Baptism and made sharers of the Paschal Mystery. That is both frightening because of what is being asked of us and also an incredible experience of the love of God. Much is now demanded of the baptized Christian; we are called to show the world what that means and to live a life of great love in Christ. The story of our life in Christ begins at baptism. Several years ago, Pope Francis on this day challenged all Catholics to remember the day of their baptism and to celebrate it as a mini birthday, to recognize and mark the day in a special way. That is an excellent thing to do! Do you know the date of your baptism? The day your life in Christ began. I was baptized on July 28, I was born on July 12, my parents didn't mess around. When were you baptized?

We have much to do in 2026 to build the Kingdom of God. I continue to take the challenge of Bishop Hicks' letter Make seriously and pray that our community does as well. Just because Bishop Hicks is moving on shortly doesn't mean that his message is now meaning less. We must Make more disciples. At the New Years' mass, I asked the community to bring in at least one new person every Sunday. So far, so good, as I have seen many new faces on the weekends in recent weeks. Let's keep it up and keep our community growing! This is also a good chance to reflect on the previous year and all that we accomplished. We finished the elevator, laid down new carpet and resurfaced the parking lot which were all much needed projects. We installed the votive candle stand which has added both beauty and devotion to our community. We have undertaken new ministries with the disabled and with those experiencing mental illness. We have 402 students enrolled in religious education and celebrated 61 First Holy Communions and 64 Confirmations. We witnessed 11 couples enter into marriage and welcomed 86 babies through Baptism. Sadly, we also celebrated 87 funerals.



RE NEWS

Today we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus which, according to the USCCB is the last day of the Christmas Season. It is the celebration before Ordinary time that recognizes the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

Centuries ago, Jesus' Baptism related to the Epiphany. So while the baptism of Christ marks the beginning of his public ministry, it is also part of his "manifestation" or "appearance"—one of the events signaling that God has broken into human history in a unique way.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK:

Question for Children: What does God want you to do? To forgive? Be generous? To love?

Question for Youth: As you grow, how do you know what God wants you to do? How do you hear the voice of God saying, "you are one of mine, of my chosen?"

Question for Adults: Today's readings lead to a core question: As you follow God and do what he wants, how do you experience his loving words: "You are my own. My favor is upon you."?

ACTIVITIES OF THE WEEK

Our commitment in Baptism is to be a servant of God, spreading the Good News of Jesus to others. Discuss one action that you could do as a family this week to spread the Good News of Jesus to others. Bring out pictures and remembrances of the Baptism of each family member. Then tell the story of those events.
