Dear community,


From the bottom of my heart thank you! Your generosity and support of this parish is overwhelming. I was blessed to inherit a parish that is on very stable financial ground. As you view the report for the 2021 – 2022 fiscal year, you can clearly see that the parish operated in the black, which is wonderful! I cannot claim any responsibility for that, it was all you and the leadership of Fr. Mike O'Keefe. The figures are very solid, especially since we were still in the initial phases of the post-COVID recovery for most of

that fiscal year. Mass attendance is now increasing and we are seeing a slight up tick in Sunday offerings so far this fiscal year, so the current budget looks to be just as solid and stable as it has been. THANK YOU!!!

As we project for the 2022 - 2023 fiscal year, there will be a significant increase in repairs & maintenance and capital expenses. We have been doing a lot of needed improvements. The rectory had significant repairs, including a new roof, done. The parish has seen the patio bricks replaced, a new security system installed, and a confessional room currently underway. Still to come is an improved sound system and a remodeling of the lobby area. Also, we have hired a part-time weekend janitor. Since, Saturday and Sunday is prime time for us when most the community is here, it makes sense to have a person on hand who can address maintenance needs immediately. Thanks be to God and your generous support, we have been able to pay for all the expenses with cash on hand and not had to dip into our parish savings account with the Diocese. What a blessing!

2023 looks to be a bright and wonderful year for Our Lady of Mount Carmel parish! It is all due to you and your love for this parish community. I am so blessed to be your pastor. Once again, from the bottom of my heart, THANK YOU!





## **Second Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Isaiah 49:3, 5-6. Psalm 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10. 1 Corinthians 1:1-3. John 1:29-34.

What Baptism Makes of Us. We begin Ordinary Times this liturgical year full of baptismal reminders. Jesus ranks ahead of John the Baptist and all of us. But though greater, he, in his good Spirit, remains with all of us. In Baptism, we are God's servants, ordained to show God's glory (and not our own), and be about God's saving plan. And like Saint Paul and the Corinthians, we are called to be holy.

- ⇒ How will I cherish Baptism today and rest in Christ loving me?
- ⇒ How will I manifest God's glory in some simple word or work?
- ⇒ How will I be holier today than I was yesterday?
