



"Care for Creation" and Laudato Si' (Part I)

- The Pope's encyclical, *Laudato Si'*, is a text of landmark significance in Catholic Social Teaching.
- Francis, like his thirteenth-century namesake, calls the earth our "common home," which is like our sister.
- But we are damaging this familial relationship as we seriously degrade the environment. In so doing, we are damaging our relationship with other humans, particularly those least equipped to adjust to the changing environment: the poor and future generations.
- The Pope encourages people to examine and change their lifestyles through sound ecological virtues, greater simplicity and less focus on material things.
- Francis extends an "urgent challenge to protect our common home ... to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that things can change."
- By taking personal action and reducing excessive consumption and waste in our lives, we can meet our obligation to reduce our impact on the environment while creating a sustainable future for generations to follow.



Cathy's Corner—A Handy Summary of Jesus' Message (based on the readings for Thursday of the Fourth Week of Easter)

Jesus knew he would be betrayed. He knew by whom he would be betrayed. And he knew it would be soon. He certainly had his disciples' attention since he had just undertaken the jarring activity of washing their feet, a task that could not be required of even the lowliest Jewish slave. So he took this opportunity to give them a succinct summary in three bullet points of the message he had been giving them throughout their time together so it would be emblazoned in their memories.

Firstly, he told them that they must believe he is I AM, the expression used in Jewish tradition meaning God's own self-designation. They must believe that he had come from God and was returning to God because they were in fact one. Secondly, they must understand that although they had been chosen to bear Jesus' message to the world, no messenger is greater than the one who sent him. It is the blessed person who always remembers that none is like to God. Thirdly, they must always receive the one Jesus sends because in doing so they are receiving Jesus himself.

And the disciples would come to find out that they might have a difficult time recognizing the one sent by Jesus. Paul, who almost single-handedly spread the message of the Lord Jesus Christ throughout the known world, not only was not originally a disciple of Jesus, but was in fact a zealous archenemy of those who were. Yet he was an instrument chosen by the Lord to carry his name before Gentiles, kings and Israelites. Indeed, the speech we hear from Paul today was the first presentation he gave in a synagogue to the Jews and God-fearers proclaiming that Christianity naturally flowed from all that God had done throughout history for the children of Israel.

The admonitions given by Jesus the last night he spent with his disciples provide a handy summary for ourselves as well outlining how to be faithful witnesses of our faith. Firstly, we must believe in a Triune God, One God in three persons, one of whom became as we are to show us how to become as God is. Secondly, we must always, always remember that no matter what we accomplish, even as related to faith and good works, it is only possible through God because no messenger could ever be greater than the one who sent her or him. Thirdly, we must receive all people as if they were Jesus – even the one we consider our archenemy - because we can never really know who has been sent by God. The most unlikely person may have been called to do God's work, unbeknownst to us and perhaps even to them. A short list, it is true, but a powerful one. Blessed are we when we are able to complete it. Acts 13:13-25; Ps 89:2-3, 21-22, 25 and 27; In 13:16-20
