



## April 30, 2023 Good Shepard Sunday

Today is known as Good Shepherd Sunday because we share today the story of the Good Shepherd from the Gospel of John. This story reminds us of the great love that God has for each of us and his willingness to lay down his life of us, his sheep. This is also a traditional day to pray for the Shepherds in our lives and our Church and to pray for vocations for new shepherds. We pray for our Holy Father, Pope Francis, that he may contin-

ue to shepherd the whole Church and show us the way to Christ through his preaching and ministry. This is especially important as he continues to face health issues. We pray today for our diocesan shepherd, Bishop Ronald Hicks. He is doing a tremendous job within the Diocese of Joliet and pointing all of us to the Lord. He will be ordained to the priesthood for the Diocese of Joliet on May 20 and will celebrate his first mass here at OLMC on Sunday, May 21 at 12 noon. It will be a wonderful celebration as Fr. Jeremy begins his ministry as a shepherd. We are also blessed to have Brother Barry Dineen, O.Carm. share with us his vocation story this weekend and how he felt called to be a Carmelite. Bro. ## Cathy's Corner— The Way to See Each Other

Saul breathed murderous threats against the Lord's disciples, against anyone who belonged to the Way, which is what the early Christian community called itself. It did not matter to him whether they were male or female, Hebrew or Hellenist – he hated them all. He hated them because his beloved Jewish faith, the faith that he had studied at the feet of the highly respected Rabbi Gamaliel, was being corrupted by these so-called children of Israel who were blaspheming against Moses and against God. Saul had even discovered that they were gathering in each other's homes and sharing bread and wine that they claimed was the body and blood of this Jesus, risen from the dead, apparently a ritual he had begun with them before he died when he called his flesh true food and his blood true drink.

To be fair, the women and men on the Way, including Ananias, had no warm thoughts about Saul from Tarsus, who was hunting down Christians and dragging them back to Jerusalem in chains. News had spread quickly of the evil things he had done to these holy people once they arrived in that city. There was no love lost between Saul and Ananias. But there was abundant love poured out upon both of them, by the Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus, who loved Ananias as one who believed in the eternal life offered through his body and blood, but who also loved Saul, even as he persecuted Jesus himself in the form of those who followed him on the Way.

And the Lord appeared to them both, and told them both what to do so they would come together, despite how they felt about each other, despite how they saw their faith so differently. It took Ananias to lay his hands on Saul for the scales of hatred to fall from his eyes so he could see in every human being the person of Christ. From then on Saul, who began to use his Hellenized name Paul, would be able to proclaim the good news that Jesus is the Son of God to the ends of the earth. But only because Ananias could open his heart and see him as a brother.

So we best be careful next time we demonize someone for what we see as corrupting our faith or despise someone for not accepting what we believe. For our Lord loves all people, even those who profess no love for the Lord. And the risen Christ continues to speak to our hearts, to fill us with the Holy Spirit that brings us together regardless of our differences. Because just as Saul and Ananias needed each other to fulfill their part of the Lord's mission, we need others to fulfill ours, perhaps most especially the others that think most differently than ourselves. May the love of the risen Lord continue to bring us together on the Way to eternal life.


