

## Cathy's Corner— The Ears That Hear God's Second Chances

The children of Israel were getting a second chance. Once more the Lord commanded Moses to present himself on top of Mount Sinai with two stone tablets. On them would be written the commandments the Lord had engraved on those that Moses had broken in his wrath over their worship of the golden calf. Indeed, Moses had placed the meeting tent, the place of divine presence, outside the camp to remind the people that their sinful behavior resulted in the Lord withdrawing from their midst.

But at the Lord's direction, once again Moses made the climb, laden with the two cumbersome slabs. To him the Lord cried out the Lord's mercy and graciousness, proclaiming the Lord's fidelity even to these people who had already strayed in wickedness and in sin. On their behalf Moses begged forgiveness. In response, the Lord reiterated the covenant promise. And this time it was Moses who wrote it all down. A new beginning offered by the God of second chances. Some would take advantage of the opportunity immediately, some as time went on, and some never.

As Jesus described in his explanation of the parable of the weeds, those second chances keep being offered as we grow and change in the field that is our world. Some people are the wheat that always follow closely the commandments that lead to the kingdom. Some are the weeds that want nothing more than to take what they desire from everyone else. Some, one may daresay most, are a combination of wheat and weed, sometimes led into sin by the Evil One who thrives on division and fear and sometimes fertilized by seeds of love sown by the Son of Man. No determination as to the final bloom is made, announced Jesus, until the harvest by the angels of God. Then the righteous who availed themselves of God's second chances will shine like the sun. But those besmitten by the advantages of acquiescing to evil will wail in anguish.

Let us not pretend that those advantages are not plentiful and easy to obtain. It becomes very easy to think we did not create institutional racism, even if we benefit greatly from it, financially and socially. Or to justify our dehumanization of the homeless and the poor by arguing how hard we worked to get where we are, regardless of the privileged place from which we began. Or to voraciously consume products made inexpensive by a labor force denied the dignity of a fair wage and often experiencing long hours and abusive conditions.

But our harvest is not yet here and God's second chances abound. We can prune the weeds of disregard for all the people who continue to be harmed by how we are benefited. We can grow the wheat of advocacy and discipline that foster a world where we live simply so others might simply live. We can begin again every day, in every way we open our eyes to see where another person, another group, another nation is made to exist in constant want and then do what we can to change that for the better. The God of second chances never ceases giving us the opportunity to do so. May ours be the ears that ever hear Jesus' cry to take advantage of each and every one.
