



### <u>Help Wanted</u> Who We need...YOU!

If you have ever considered working with our youngest parishioners, then now is the time to say YES! There are several ways that you can help us. We are looking for catechists and assistant catechists for all sessions. We would like enough faith filled people to work together in a team-teaching capacity.

People ask if they need to be a teacher by trade to "become" a catechist. The simple answer is no, because what our children really need are faith filled individuals sharing their faith by the way they live. While being a teacher is beneficial, practicing faith is integral. Pope Francis said this in his message to participants in the First International Catechetical Symposium:

Catechesis is not a "job" or a task that is external to the person who is a catechist; because one "is" a catechist and all of life revolves around this mission. In fact, being a catechist is a vocation of service to the Church; what was received as a gift from the Lord should be transmitted in turn. Thus, catechists must constantly return to that first announcement of kerygma which is the gift that changed their life. It is the fundamental proclamation that must continuously resound in the life of Christians, even more so in those who are called to proclaim and teach the faith.

So, if you feel called, we offer the tools and resources you need to fulfill this task. It's not about the knowledge you have, but the willingness to share what you really believe and practice. If you are reading this, then you are already involved. Please prayerfully consider helping our young parishioners.

We also need office help, parking lot attendants, hallway monitors, substitutes, and occasional or seasonal help for various retreats.

Please remember that all volunteers with children or vulnerable adults do need to be compliant with our Safe Environment policies.

### **Questions of the Week**

**Question for Children:** What is one way you can be closer to Jesus today?

Question for Youth: We are assured that God will be with us as we go through life, so what strategy do you use to keep God in mind as you deal with the ups and downs of life as a young adult?

Question for Adults: Share about a time when life's struggles were so difficult for you that you nearly "threw in the towel." What signs did you see then that God remained with you?

### Activities of the Week

Talk about the challenges which your family faces at this time? How can you work together to overcome those challenges?

Hold a family picnic this week as summer vacation draws to an end or as our society gets ready to return to the regular activities of early autumn.
