## January 1, 2024

Wow!!! It is 2024! I want to wish everyone in the community all the best in this upcoming year. I pray that each of us is blessed with health in the year ahead because that is the most important thing. A new year is a time for us to pause and reflect on the past and prepare for the future. 2022 was a year of change for the parish community. The Gospel for the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, is the story of the shepherds visit to the manger. It says all were amazed at what the shepherds said, and Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart. Let us hold our loved ones dear and reflect on all that has happened this past year. 2023 was a

wonderful year for our parish community. We had Bishop Hicks with us in January for my official installation as pastor. (Time sure flies!) We got the lobby changed by removing all the old bulletin boards and installing monitors and furniture. It is now a warm and welcoming area. I love to see people sitting there talking with others, catching up and sharing a cup of coffee. That is what community is all about. It has also been a year since we switched to a 4:30 pm Mass on Saturday. This has made a significant difference and attendance has increased. The confessional room in the lobby has been put to beneficial use and is a blessing. It sure beats sitting in the chapel. We had a wonderful celebration of Our Lady of Mount Carmel in July, with a parish picnic afterwards which was a lot of fun. We planted 16 new trees to beautify the grounds and help the environment. The food pantry helps so many in need and the holiday food drives are among the highlights of this community and speaks to our commitment to serve the poor and needy. Our religious education and youth programs have about 500 children and teens involved. This is critical to pass the faith on to the next generation. Sadly, we had to say farewell to Fr. Greg in October. Fortunately, we were blessed to welcome Fr. Rob to our parish, and he has been a wonderful addition. There was so much to be grateful for in 2023.

Here are some interesting facts about our parish from last year. We celebrated 59 baptisms which are always a blessing to the church. We had 59 children receive their First Holy Communion and 72 teens were Confirmed. We witnessed 12 marriages. Sadly, we had to celebrate 76 funerals. 72 hours of Adoration were given and over 30 hours of confession time offered. All this is to the glory of God. We have so much to be grateful for.

We now look ahead to 2024 with much hope. We will seek ways to expand our outreach to the poor and seek what we can do for our community. We are researching ways to evangelize and bring more people into the church, especially those who may have fallen away and not been to church in many years. We will continue our care for creation through planting more trees, adding more LED lighting and pursuing solar energy for the parish. Most of all, we will be working together to building the kingdom of God here in Darien together.
