

There are now two candles lit on our Advent Wreath, things are getting serious! The coming of Christ on Christmas will be here before we know it. We must continue our preparation. It is pretty common to see people, especially younger people, with ear buds and headphones constantly. While there is nothing wrong with a little entertainment and listening to music occasionally, it in my opinion has become excessive for many. How many times have we seen people at restaurants and other social gatherings with family and

someone has headphones on. They are not being present in the moment and not giving their full attention. They are not really listening to anything. They are not listening to important conversations going on around them and missing out on the opportunity for deeper connection with loved ones and friends. Sadly, we can also put on our spiritual headphones and miss out on the chance to hear the voice of God speaking.

The gospel today is the introduction of John the Baptist. He is a voice crying out in the desert. Again, whose voice are we listening to? People did not listen to John the Baptist then. People did not listen to Jesus then. People still do not listen to Jesus today. People do not listen to the modern prophets that are among us. Whose voice are you listening to? The gospel warns us, that the winnowing fan is ready. The time will come. Advent is a season of preparation for us. To get us ready for what will be. To get us to start listening to the word of the Lord in our life. This is the time for all of us to take a good look at ourselves. Are we putting things into our ears in order to keep the voice of the Lord out? Are we not paying attention to the words being spoken to us clearly every day through Scripture and the Sacraments? Whose voice are you listening to in your life?

As we try to listen to the voice crying out in the desert of our lives this Advent there are several events here in the parish that may be of help. Today, Sunday, December 7 Fr. Rob will be offering an afternoon reflection titled "Advent: A time of waiting with Mary." The reflection is a great way for us to slow down and spend some time thinking about the real reason for Advent. On Monday, December 15 at 7pm, we will have our parish reconciliation service. Reconciliation is the best way to prepare for Christmas and to truly have our sins forgiven. Please take advantage of these opportunities as a means of preparing for the coming of Christ.

Immaculate Conception

December 8th is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary and celebrates Mary being conceived without sin. Our 7:00 PM Monday session will attend Mass as it is a Holy Day of Opportunity.

Mary said "yes" to God's call without knowing what it would mean. Her story shows that nothing is impossible with God. Think of one area of your family life that you think is impossible. During prayer time this week, ask God for assistance with that family situation.

Gather with your family and say the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary together. Ask Mary to give you the courage to listen to God as she did.

Each of us has a place in the unfolding story of our family history. How have you carried on the story of faith in your family?

Questions of the Week:

<u>Question for Children:</u> Beyond toys and other things, what do you hope will happen in your family this Christmas?

Question for Youth: What are the greatest challenges you face as a young person today in terms of allowing Christ to be your teacher and following him?

Question for Adults: Name the one thing in your life which you must "move out of the way" in order to make more room for Christ – a grudge, a possession, a memory, hurt, or feeling.

Activities of the Week

Prepare for Christmas by talking together about family members who have been influential in your lives. Go through the family album and point out pictures of people who are good role models of Christian living. Tell their stories to your family. Discuss which of them has brought the light of Christ into your lives this year.

Take an amaryllis bulb to a homebound person or a nursing home resident. Visit the person often during the Advent season, and together watch the plant grow and bloom for Christmas. You and the flower will both be signs of God's reign of love in our midst.
