

#### Cathy's Corner—Building God's Kingdom in a Brand New Nation

Happily married at the age of 19 to a handsome and wealthy businessman, the union from which brought five children, steeped in her Episcopalian faith, could the New York City socialite Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seton ever have imagined that she would be remembered forever as a groundbreaking American Catholic saint? Yet after her husband died only seven years into their marriage in Italy, where Elizabeth had taken him in the hopes of curing his tuberculosis, her life took a dramatic turn. Her time overseas had exposed her to Catholicism and she converted, a poverty-stricken widow shunned by relatives and friends for embracing what was considered a heretic faith.

The invitation of the president of St. Mary's College in Baltimore to open a school for Catholic girls in that city led her on a path to establishing St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, sowing the seeds of Catholic education in the United States. Other women joined her teaching mission and with them Elizabeth founded the first American-based Catholic religious community, the Sisters of St. Joseph. Now Mother Seton, she continued to teach and work for her order, renamed the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, and expanded to 20 communities. She died on this day in 1821, only 46 years old, and with her canonization in 1975 she became the first American-born citizen to be named a Catholic saint.

Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seton never dreamed that she would lay the foundation in many ways for Catholic ministry to grow and thrive in the United States from its very beginning as an independent nation. Her thoughts were only on acting in righteousness as one begotten by God and hence loving all of God's children. She accepted the same invitation given by Jesus to the disciples of John the Baptist to "come, and you will see," following him even when it meant leaving everything she had known behind. Her recognition of him as Messiah led to doing his work, teaching in her schools, preaching in her communities, healing those wounded by poverty.

Spurned by the society into which she was born, the embodiment of her own words to always live simply, so all may simply live, she remained in God, trusting that the Spirit within her was greater than all the adversities of the world. She understood what our faith requires us all to embrace, that God has given us what we need to build the kingdom of Heaven on earth. When so rich a harvest is before us, why do we not gather it? All is in our hands if we will but use it. That, Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, is the question that even two hundred years later, we all still must answer.
