

#### Cathy's Corner— A Fig Tree and Money Changer Sandwich

Intercalation is the insertion of something between or among existing elements or layers. In the Gospel of Mark it is a literary convention employed wherein a narration is broken in two, with a completely different tale inserted within, known familiarly as a "sandwich technique." This interlacing aids in revealing the mutual interpretation and intended meaning of stories which at first glance may seem entirely unrelated. Certainly Jesus cursing the fig tree and, in the middle, cleansing the temple appear to be just a bit of creative storytelling.

Indeed, it is hard to even comprehend any purpose for the former, which depicts Jesus as cursing forever a fig tree which seasonally was not ready to bear fruit for not having any fruit, simply because he happened to be hungry. Truly that just seems irrational and, to be honest, un-Christlike. Unless you look at what was sandwiched in between: the cleansing of the temple. Jesus' action of overturning the tables of the money changers and the seats of those selling doves, accompanied by his teaching that it was prayer and not commerce that should be taking place in God's house, clearly evince his claim of superiority over the religious practices of Israel and a challenge to the priestly authorities who currently held sway.

In light of that understanding, the fig tree becomes a designation for Israel, as employed by prophets such as Jeremiah, who announced the Lord's punishment for disobedience by crying out: *I will gather them all in, says the Lord: no grapes on the vine, No figs on the fig trees, foliage withered!* Cursing the fig tree becomes then a parable in action illustrating the judgment of Jesus on the barrenness of Israel's worship and the eventual fate of Jerusalem for rejecting his teaching. Indeed, the fig tree cursed by Jesus went beyond its inability to produce fruit by withering down to its very roots, an even more frightening prospect in that context.

Yet the story does not end there. Jesus leaves the disciples, and us so many centuries later, with the message that with faith in God, even a mountain can be lifted up and thrown into the sea. Even a fig tree cursed to its very roots can be revived. Even a people that have lost their way can be made anew by belief and prayer and forgiveness. So let us believe that we can be a people who bear the fruit of the kingdom of God rather than the barrenness of empty platitudes. Let us pray that we can put the needs of God's people over the filling of our pocketbooks. Let us forgive others, and ourselves, for all the times we have failed to act as those extolled in the Book of Sirach, as godly women and men whose virtues are not forgotten. Then let us work together to make God's house, our world, a place for all peoples, to live and love and pray as God has intended them to do, not as we envision they should do. An intercalation of love and mercy and justice — a heavenly sandwich worthy of offering to our God.


