

Cathy's Corner— The Roadmap to the Most High

The disciples knew Jesus was describing for them what we think of as heaven, the spiritual dwelling place of the Most High wherein the angelic hosts forever sing praise and thanksgiving to God. As comforting as it probably was to hear that Jesus was going there to prepare a place for them, the practical Thomas was understandably concerned that they had no idea how to actually get there. After all, Jesus was not handing over a roadmap made of papyrus inscribed with secret details of heavenly geography. He was just offering this cryptic pronouncement that they, in fact, knew the way. His follow-up statement that he is the way and the truth and the life likely did not clarify the directions for them. In fact, Jesus was discussing this with them as part of the Last Supper discourse and afterwards, when Jesus was arrested and condemned to death, they did not stay around to decipher what he had meant. They scattered and they hid.

But when God raised Jesus from the dead, as Paul was explaining to those in the synagogue in Antioch, Jesus did not leave them to their confusion and despair. He did not leave them to believe he had abandoned them forever without telling them how to find him. He appeared for many days to those same disciples, and others as well, while they were making their way back into a life without him. And they realized with great joy the good news that Jesus was himself the roadmap, just as he had already said. They realized that the promise made by God to their ancestors to raise up for them the Messiah had been fulfilled in Jesus. They realized that Jesus is the Way.

Indeed, when Paul was still breathing murderous threats against the disciples of the risen Lord, that is the name they had given to themselves, those who belonged to the Way. Because following Jesus is a way of life, not a handbook of guidelines that can be picked up and put back down as the mood strikes. It is adherence to a path that is the Lord, the truth that leads to life for all of God's creation, from which neither societal scorn nor financial forfeit can sway us. It is the Way that brings us to the dwelling place of peace and joy that exists only in the Most High, prepared for those who share that peace and joy with all they meet. Even in our own deepest confusion and despair, we have in our grasp that roadmap. And all it takes to get there is to realize that, in Jesus, we already are.


