

This is going to shock no one in our community, but I love sports. Football is my favorite of course, but I do watch all the major sports. I even for several years coached lacrosse despite having never played it and not knowing much about it. I read the rule book, fortunately the head coach was much more experienced. My main contribution was yelling "run faster!" or "Get the ball!" However, running faster was really the key to it all. The boys always wanted to

learn new and fancy techniques. The coaches kept saying, practice the fundamentals and run more. You will not be able to do any of those fancy plays for real if you are tired and worn out in the 4th Quarter. You have to have the stamina to keep up. Those is developed by practicing the basics and running more. Our spiritual life is kind of the same way. It is more an endurance test than anything else. How much can we endure and keep going. Our readings today make that point for us. Sometimes it is the person with the best endurance, not necessarily the best skill who will win the fight. In this last Sunday in Ordinary time, our readings take on the tone of death and the afterlife. The first reading talks about the Day of Judgment coming like a blazing oven. The second reading, St. Paul talks about endurance kind of the theme for the day. Paul says in toil and drudgery, day and night we worked among you. Not something we like to hear, but endurance to just see things through to the end. The gospel makes the same point for us. It speaks of the wars, famines and earthquakes that we will have to endure. It is not necessarily the end though. They are the bad things that we need to endure, just to get through it. Hopefully to bring some type of peaceful resolution to the problems as well.

We are challenged to look at our life this day. The last Sunday of ordinary time is kind of a downer in its theme and its reading. It challenges us to look to the end. Where are our lives heading. We do give up because practice is too hard. We don't like running all those miles and would rather sit on the couch. Or do we keep getting up morning after morning and running and running some more. If we hope to make it to the later rounds in the fight we better. Endurance is the key to everything. The last line of the Gospel today says "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." Keep running my friends. It will come in handy

I am looking forward to our brunch to celebrate New Years Day. We will have mass at 10 am and then proceed across the lot to Alpine Banquets for brunch. Tickets are \$30, children under 12 are half price. I hope you can join us!
