"Zeal for your house will consume me." This line is spoken in today's Gospel as we celebrate the Dedication of St. John Laternan Basilica. It is known as the "Mother and Head of all the churches in Rome and in the world." Many people assume that St. Peter's Basilica is the most important church, but it is actually St. John's. It serves as the Cathedral of Rome, which is the seat of the Bishop of Rome, who is our pope. This is the only feast day dedicated to a building, which may seem odd, but

it shows the importance of this Church building to the Universal Church. The cathedral was founded in the year 324 AD and named for St. John the Apostle. The land was donated by the Laterani family, who were leading citizens of Rome. That is where the name "Lateran" comes from. Many members of the Laterani family served as senators and generals in the army for generations. The Laterani Palace still stands next to the Cathedral and was the residence of the Pope for hundreds of years until construction of St Peter's and the Vatican, which began in 1506. That is a little history lesson, but the real question is does zeal for your house consume me?

This feast day calls us back to remember our roots and be passionate about living out of our faith. The Church is more than a physical building. It is you and I living our faith and putting the love of Christ into action in our community. We are called to continue to spread the Gospel and the love of Christ to all, to have that zeal! We continue to extend the invitation to bring new people to Christ and be part of our parish community. I want to challenge everyone to extend that invitation to someone to come to church again. Many people have fallen away from the practice of the faith and lost that zeal for lots of reasons. We have to continue to invite and pray the Holy Spirit moves hearts to want to be on zeal again. As a parish, we are trying to take Bishop Hicks' letter "Make" to heart and have that desire to make more disciples at the center of what we do. We all have a part to play, we can all extend the invitation to someone to come back, rekindle the zeal again. Let's keep finding ways to make disciples for the Lord.

My deepest thanks go out to all who donated towards the new carpet. It looks wonderful and is close match to the previous carpet, didn't want to cause too much shock. Also a big thanks to all who helped mover chairs after the noon mass and to all who came out last Saturday to help put the church back together. Thanks for showing that zeal for your house!
