

The Gospel this Sunday is the cleansing of the 10 leapers. In the story, all ten were healed but only one returned to say thank you to Jesus. It is really easy for us to become complacent and not truly give thanks for the blessing in our life. Sure, each of us has some struggle and some unique cross to carry in life, however, each of us is very blessed. The fact that we are sitting here in church is a blessing. We were all blessed with waking up this morning and having the physical ability to leave the house and gather here. What a blessing

that is! So many in our community are seriously ill or for other reasons unable to leave their home. We have a home to live in, food on our table and people who love and care about us. We are all so blessed in his community. Let us always give thanks, count our blessings, and never cease praising God for his goodness. The well-known Dominican theologian from Peru, Fr. Gustavo Gutierrez once wrote, "The foundation of faith is gratitude." That line has always stuck with me. It is when we realize how blessed and fortunate we are and from whom those blessings come from, that real faith begins to form. As we reflect on the Gospel for this Sunday (Lk 17:11-19), let us count our blessing and be the one who returns to Christ to say thank you! We will do our gratitude pumpkins again. I encourage everyone to write one thing for which they are grateful on the pumpkin. The gratitude pumpkins will be out on the patio throughout the fall to remind us to give thanks!

I encourage everyone to please read Bishop Hicks' letter "Make." It should be a challenge to every Catholic. The purpose of this letter is to encourage us all to make other disciples. We have some issues that we need to work on if we want Our Lady of Mount Carmel to be sustainable in the future. We need more faithful people in the seats! We are on track to do close to 100 funerals in 2025. Who is going to replace those lost? If we honestly look around at the mass crowd on the weekends, the majority of people are 65+. If we want an active, vibrant parish 10 – 15 years from now, we need to start getting more people in their 30's, 40's and 50's into our seats. We need to explore methods to attract younger generations to the faith. For most of our ministries, it is the same core group of parishioners that seem to volunteer, how can we bring fresh faces to our ministries? These are the issues that the letter "Make" is asking us to look at. On Thursday, October 23 will have two sessions, in the morning and evening called, "Let's have a conversation." I hope that all who wish to discuss "Make" and want to begin to be better evangelizers will attend.


Here are the items we do accept:

- Clothing, shoes, boots
- **Jewelry**
- Hats, gloves, mittens, scarves
- Books, records, CDs, DVDs Games, toys, sports equipment
- Housewares: dishes, glassware, kitchen utensils, lamps, small appliances
- Hand tools and power tools
- Linens, curtains, blankets, etc Stereos, radios, VCRs, DVD players, Blu-ray players, CD players, Gaming consoles, remotes, video games
- Camcorders, cameras, camera lens attachments
- Office supplies
- Office equipment: printers, copiers, scanners, toner cartridges, electric typewriters, word processors
- Furniture: Dressers, tables, sofas, bed frames (not including water bed frames) etc.
- Refrigerators, freezers, stoves/ovens, washers/dryers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers,
- Old clothes (ripped, worn out clothes; just ask that bags or boxes are marked recycling)
- Old book and magazines; just ask the boxes or bags are marked recycling

Here are the items we do not accept:

- Cribs, car seats, etc.
- Household chemical products: pesticides, paint, paint thinner, drain cleaner, oven cleaner, aerosols, etc. Automotive hazardous waste: tires, lead acid batteries, additives, gasoline, oils, antifreeze, etc.
- furnace, trash compactors, water heaters
- Any furniture with the following: stains, animal fur, missing or broken pieces
- Used mattresses or box springs
- Open/partially used personal care: Shampoo, conditioner, nail polish remover, shaving cream, hairspray, shavers, perfume
- Weapons

October is the Month of the Rosary

Last week, during opening prayer, our families did a decade of the Rosary based on Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen's Mission Rosary for families of the world.

The World Mission Rosary was envisioned by Archbishop Fulton John Sheen in 1951, when he was national director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. He made the request on a radio show, asking that his listeners "Embrace the world in prayer."



This week we will pray the Mission Rosary Prayer for Oceania (on the Blue Beads). Blue is for the water surrounding the island nations of the world-Oceania:

We Pray for the Families of Oceania. Help us to remember the ripple we make in all that we do. We pray for those who live with flooding and storms. We pray that your message, o Lord, spread as waves on the ocean. We pray for all families of Oceania.

Question for Adults: What are some ways you can think of to show gratitude to God? Make them concrete and real.


Activities of the Week
