As we head into the month of October, we really start to see the change in temperatures and fall happening all around us. This means for many of us time to start cleaning up our gardens. The last of the produce is in and its time to prepare the garden beds for winter. What was one so luscious, green and full of life is now brown and decaying. The seeds we planted back in the spring have now done their thing. Are the seeds that were planted in us, however long ago, have they done their thing and grown? How much produce has grown

in our lifetime? The Gospel today has the apostles asking Jesus to "increase our faith." Jesus responds with, "If you have faith he size of a mustard seed," you would be able to do great things! A mustard seed is tiny. It's not like a peach or avocado pit; you can barely see a mustard see on your fingertip. Do we even have that much faith? Faith is always expressed through our actions. It is in how we love one another and the service we share with those who are need. Love and service are obligations for the faithful. "When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done only what we were obliged to do." Are we doing what we are obliged to?

One thing that all the faithful are obliged to do is make other disciples. Jesus tells us to go out and make disciples, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. The priests of the Diocese of Joliet recently had our bi-annual convocation, and the theme was "Make", to make disciples. Bishop Hicks has just released his first pastoral letter to the people of the diocese. He challenges us to make other disciples by our witness. The bishop's letter is available on the Diocese of Joliet's webpage and I encourage all parishioners to read it and hopefully be as inspired by it as I am. I want to challenge our parish to "Make" more disciples. I am not sure how yet, if anyone is interested in forming a committee to help me brainstorm ideas, please let me know. Every October we do mass attendance counts, so if you see someone walking around with a counter, don't be disturbed. October of 2022, our average mass attendance on a weekend was 999. In October of 2023 the average attendance was 1068. In October of 2024, attendance was 1184. From 2022 – 2024, we saw a 18% increase. That is decent growth, however we need to keep the momentum going. Let's explore ways to "Make" disciples here in Darien.

### October is the Month of the Rosary

As we enter the month of October, we reflect on the Rosary, and we ask that your family pray the World Mission Rosary together for the families of the World at least once this October.

The World Mission Rosary was envisioned by Archbishop Fulton John Sheen in 1951, when he was national director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. He made the request on a radio show, asking that his listeners "Embrace the world in prayer."

For each of the following weeks, we ask your family to pray a decade of the Rosary for one of the Continents of the world.

## This week we will pray the Mission Rosary Prayer for Africa (on the Green Beads):

We Pray for the Families of Africa. Ubuntu- an ancient African philosophy that speaks to the interconnectedness of all things and of each other: I am because we are. Ubuntu understands that we need to work together in order to succeed. The prayer: As we pray for all the families in Africa, may we recognize that we need each other in order to survive. May we realize that no one is beyond the reach of God.

Our world is in need of much prayer, so why not take the time to pray for all our brothers and sisters around the world, as well as for all of us here in our country. God bless you!


### What's Happening in RE
