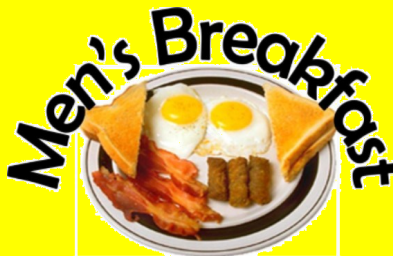

Tom's Turn – Stay Vulnerable, Stay Light

The melody that came over the voicemail was anything but pleasant. Some guy I don't know. Who knows the source of his pain? He sang a tune of his own composition. It began with "Jesus Christ ___s! Jesus Christ ___s!" a tacky refrain he repeated a dozen times. Then he went on to describe how he was using the Bible for, well, don't bother guessing. And that was only the first half of the recording. Then he decided to get truly nasty, accusing me, or the church generally, or some minister he had known sometime in his life, of pedophilia and worse - if there is worse.

It was a new voice, but an old tune, one I'm glad no one else on our staff had to hear - at least this time. We get such calls from time to time. It's just part of the life we lead in the church office. It can be difficult. It can cause one to want to put up walls, to close ranks, to seek absolute security, to seek some shadow place in which to hide. But that's the last thing for a church to do.

In this, my last Tom's Turn, I encourage you always to choose vulnerability over walls and light over any sort of shadows. After all we just finished a feast time because of the One most vulnerable, the Way, the Truth, the source of all light. I hope you took the season slow, as one scholar said, "learning how to trust an emerging light rather than seize it too quickly." Because as the unhappy heart behind that vulgar voicemail bore witness, life is fragile, never finished.

But it is in response to that fragility that our Good News bears witness. For our news is that God came among us and is always with us. God did not come armor plated but vulnerable. God did not come triumphant but born of a

peasant woman. Holiness was born into a body that could be hurt and was ultimately killed. Born on the margins. Born at risk.

Weakness is the church's disposition. Fragility is its way in the world. It is our lot as Christians, not because of our choice but because of God's example. We live in a nation of people overstimulated and undernourished. We find ourselves distracted to the point where we can no longer feel at all. To be vulnerable as Jesus was, is to find our way back to sensation. Then we can truly care. Then we can be here for each other. Then we can stay light. Then we can be light.

Beginning next week, I will do something I do not know how to do. I feel defenseless and exposed because I have no good example of how to retire. One grandfather was well past retirement age when I was born and the other was dead well before he retired. My father died before he retired. And I don't have good examples from the women in my family either. So, I feel quite susceptible to failure. It is quite a leap into the unknown.

Likewise, this congregation is in a position it has not been in for the last quarter of a century. You may feel in these next weeks and months exposed, helpless, and weak. For both of us, then, I guess the example of our Lord must be one we take to heart. For vulnerability was his calling card. And light was the fruit he bore. May you and I do the same.

And, for the last time, I'll see you on Sunday. Remember to share your bread with the needy and to find a way to share God's love even if only with a smile. To prepare for worship Sunday read Acts 10:34-43.
