Kind Words Spoken

Every Sunday morning, our Regional Minister, Andy Mangum, posts a prayer on Facebook. Last Sunday's prayer was about ministry, those at the beginning through ordination, those in the middle being installed in a new place, and those who are concluding their ministry in retirement. He wrote some very kind words about our retired minister, Tom. I wanted to share it with you, Church Family. Gary Dunn

He writes: "As I write this morning's prayer, I'm mindful of how much is happening in the world that deserves both pastoral and prophetic attention. Yet, before I am anything else, I am a child of the Church—and today is a good day for the Church.

Finally, today marks the retirement of Rev. Tom Plumbley at First Christian Church of Fort Worth. I first spoke with Tom by phone while in seminary. At the time, he was pastor of one of the first—and then one of the few—Open and Affirming congregations in Texas. He shared with me the story of that journey while I was working on a research project about preaching and congregational identity. Tom said that, in some sense, every sermon he preached addressed the question of who we are becoming as a congregation.

As a new Disciple, I had grown up in a tradition where proclamation focused primarily on the individual believer—who they are becoming as maturing

Christians. That conversation opened my eyes to something distinctive about the Christian Church, the Christian Church Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). We believe the Church—locally, regionally, generally, universally—is something in God's eyes. The Church is not merely a mechanism for making more Christians.

The Church in every manifestation is an act of God. I have returned to and built on that reality for 30 years, but I first heard it articulated by my friend Tom. When I was called to FCC Irving, Tom was still at Midway Hills. From then on, I considered him an older brother in ministry, someone whose patterns and practices were aspirational to me. Tom's voice for justice and his understanding that pastors help shape the city and county (not just the nation) should serve as a model for us all. His retirement is well deserved, and I pray it is life-giving and restorative. But we will miss him.

Linnea, recently ordained, Bill, recently named senior minister and Tom would each remind us not to turn away from the realities before us, but to face them realistically and courageously. I agree. Still, today is a good day for the Church. And it is good to give thanks to God.

Holy One, God and Savior of us all, every good and perfect gift, every generous act of sharing, every charism of ministry, every true word proclaimed, every kind act of service, every bold witness for life in the face of this world's threatening patterns of death comes from You. You are the origin, ground, and horizon of our

being as persons, as the Church, the Church, the Christian Church, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), the Christian Church in the Southwest, and our local congregational families.

Today, we give thanks for the gift of ministry and consecrate the energy of new beginnings, the faithfulness of mid-journey vistas, and the celebration of ministries reaching blessed, yet never final, trails end. We thank You for allowing our paths to walk alongside fellow sojourners like Linnea, Bill, and Tom. Each brings to our shared ministry the gifts and graces You have granted, joining together with those special representatives, the ministers, within this mendicant collective we call the Church.

Your ministers, O God, have both lazed new trails and taught us how to walk the well-worn paths of faith. They have set a pace that sometimes felt too fast, yet they have also prioritized rest and sabbath. They have led us toward shade when the sunlight threatened our strength and given us courage when the moon drove us to despair. They have been the hands and feet through whom You have fulfilled Your promise to lead, guide, and protect us.

When we looked to the hills and acknowledged that our help comes from You, time and again You have sent Your faithful ministers to us. Each time we remember them, we give thanks to You. Amen."
