## Homeowners Association



A homeowner association (HOA) is a private, legally incorporated organization that helps govern a residential community by collecting dues and establishing guidelines for residents. There are several HOAs located around Lake Madison, and the Lake Madison Development Association is working to ensure that each HOA has at least one representative serving on our Board of Directors.

To help us improve communication, we ask each HOA to email LMDASD@OUTLOOK.COM with the name of your HOA and the primary contact (typically the HOA President). This allows LMDA to share important updates directly with HOA leadership, who can pass that information on to residents.


Having accurate HOA contact information is especially important during emergencies such as tornadoes, derechos, or flooding, when timely communication can help keep our lake community informed and safe.



## Game, Fish & Parks Update

### Winter Lake Safety

Ice fishing is in full swing, but safety should always come first. No ice is 100% safe, and conditions can change quickly due to weather, snow cover, and water movement. Always check ice thickness as you go and never rely solely on reports from others. Carry safety gear such as ice picks, a rope, or a life vest, and let someone know your plans before heading out. Be extra cautious when using ATVs or vehicles, and remember that river and lake ice are not the same. Staying alert and prepared helps ensure a safe and enjoyable ice fishing season for you, your family, and everyone enjoying winter on the lake, and helps prevent accidents before they happen.




A solid ice layer helps stabilize water temperatures and protects fish from sudden cold snaps. Snow cover also reduces light penetration, which slows algae growth and helps maintain balance in the lake during winter months.

Items left on the ice – including trash, fishing line, or untreated runoff from vehicles – can end up in the lake during spring melt. Practicing clean, responsible recreation in winter helps protect water quality year-round.
