Protecting Our Lake Starts With You

Summer is in full swing, and July is one of the busiest times of the year on Lake Madison. Families are enjoying weekends on the water, anglers are finding their favorite fishing spots, and visitors are discovering everything our lake community has to offer. With all of that activity comes a shared responsibility to protect one of our area's greatest natural resources.

The health of Lake Madison depends on the choices each of us makes every day. Fortunately, many of the most effective ways to protect the lake are also the simplest.

One of the biggest threats to South Dakota lakes is the spread of aquatic invasive species. Before launching your boat, inspect your trailer, propeller, anchor, and equipment for any aquatic plants or debris. Drain all water from live wells, ballast tanks, and bilges before leaving a boat ramp, and never transport water from one body of water to another. These few extra minutes help protect Lake Madison from invasive species that can permanently alter water quality, recreation, and fish habitat.

Keeping the lake clean is equally important. Always bring a trash bag on the boat and pack out everything you bring in. Fishing line, beverage containers, food wrappers, and even small pieces of litter can harm wildlife and diminish the beauty of our shoreline. If you notice trash that isn't yours, consider picking it up. Small acts of stewardship make a noticeable difference.

Property owners also play an important role in protecting water quality. Fertilizers, grass clippings, leaves, and other yard debris can wash into the lake after heavy rains, adding nutrients that contribute to algae growth. Maintaining a healthy shoreline with native plants, limiting fertilizer use near the water, and directing runoff away from the lake all help preserve clear water for everyone.

Every person who enjoys Lake Madison has a stake in its future. Whether you live here year-round, spend weekends at the lake, or are visiting for the first time, your actions matter. By working together, we can ensure Lake Madison remains a beautiful destination for boating, fishing, swimming, and making memories for generations to come.

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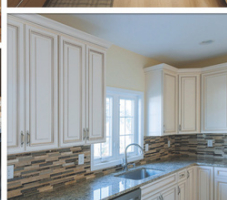
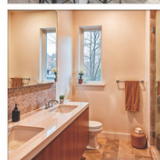
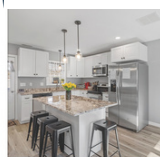

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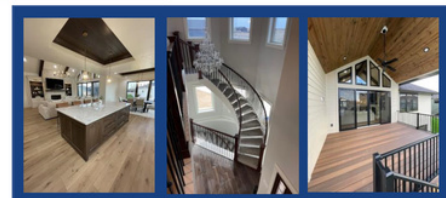
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The Value of Being an LMDA Member

Be sure you have a properly fitting life jacket for every occupant in your boat. Life jacket stations located at Johnson Point, Scott Peterson Memorial Park, and Walker's Point are available, and we encourage you to use them. When boating, make way for non-motorized watercraft and swimmers as well.

Outdoor safety goes beyond water safety. Use sun protection and stay hydrated. Dehydration can lead to serious health issues and poor judgment due to fatigue. Stay Safe by drinking plenty of water. If you feel tired or drowsy, take a break. Be observant of youth and others too - heat stroke can come on quickly if you aren't careful.

We hope everyone is enjoying our state's great resources and spending time outdoors. Continue making memories and carry on our South Dakota heritage by stepping outside and enjoying the outdoors.

Summer Storm Safety on the Lake Know Before You Go!

South Dakota weather can change quickly during the summer months.

Before heading out:

- Check the weather forecast.
- Keep an eye on developing clouds.
- Have a weather app or weather radio available.
- Wear your life jacket.
- Make sure your navigation lights are working if you'll be out after sunset.

If thunder is heard or lightning is seen, head to shore immediately. High winds and rough water can develop in just minutes.

A little preparation goes a long way toward ensuring everyone returns home safely.

Update on LMDA Water Quality BMP Program Acres reduced to enroll land into the Lake Madison Development Association (LMDA) Best Management Plan Incentive Program

Perhaps the most important core mission of the LMDA is the maintenance or improvement of the water quality in Lake Madison. There is hardly a resident or landowner in Lake County who doesn't or hasn't benefited from activities associated with Lake Madison.

In September of 2023, the LMDA entered into an agreement with East Dakota Water Development District (EDWDD) to create an incentive grant program that would seek to thank any landowner within the Lake Madison watershed who enrolled 40 acres or more into the USDA Conservation Reserve Program, or related best management plan (BMP) programs. The one-time payment would be awarded once the land was enrolled in the BMP program and could be used for any costs associated with the project. Recently the number of acres needed to enroll in the program has been reduced from 40 acres to 15 acres.

The three criteria that would determine the land's eligibility into the program would be:

- a minimum of 15 acres
- the land would have to lie within ¼ mile of a water body - (stream, lake, slough, etc.)
- parcel will be determined, by the LMDA and staff of EDWDD, to provide a water quality benefit to the watershed.

Investing in the Future of Lake Madison Fishing

South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks continues to invest in the future of fishing on Lake Madison. On June 11, 2026, fisheries biologists stocked juvenile walleye in Lake Madison as part of their ongoing management efforts to maintain a healthy and sustainable fish population.

Walleye are one of South Dakota's most sought-after sport fish, and while Lake Madison supports natural reproduction, supplemental stockings help strengthen year classes and provide excellent fishing opportunities for years to come. It takes several years for these young fish to reach harvestable size, making today's stocking an investment in the future of the lake.

Fish stocking is only one part of maintaining a quality fishery. Habitat protection, clean water, responsible boating, preventing the spread of aquatic invasive species, and following fishing regulations all work together to ensure Lake Madison remains one of eastern South Dakota's premier fishing destinations.

The next time you're on the water, remember that some of the fish you catch in the coming years may have begun their journey during this year's stocking efforts. By working together to care for our lake, we're helping preserve outstanding fishing opportunities for future generations.



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Looking Back at Lake Madison

Preserving the Stories That Shaped Our Lake

When the Chautauqua Came to Lake Madison

Today, Lake Madison is known as a place where families gather to boat, fish, swim, and enjoy South Dakota summers. More than a century ago, however, the lake was also home to one of the region's most celebrated cultural destinations—the Lake Madison Chautauqua.

Established in 1891 on the lake's northwest shore, the Lake Madison Chautauqua became part of a nationwide movement that brought education, music, religion, and entertainment to communities across America. At a time before radio and television, Chautauquas gave people the opportunity to hear nationally known speakers, musicians, educators, and performers without traveling to a major city.

Lake Madison provided the perfect setting. Families spent several days—or even an entire week—attending lectures and concerts while enjoying the beauty of the lake. Many camped on the grounds or stayed in nearby cottages and the Grand Hotel, which became a centerpiece of the Chautauqua experience.

As attendance grew, transportation to the lake improved. Visitors initially traveled by horse and buggy, but a narrow-gauge railroad was eventually built to carry passengers from Madison directly to the Chautauqua grounds. Later, the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway added a spur line, making travel even easier and helping establish Lake Madison as one of South Dakota's premier summer destinations.

For more than four decades, the Chautauqua drew thousands of visitors from South Dakota and neighboring states. Beyond its educational programs, it created a strong sense of community. Families returned year after year, friendships were formed, and traditions were established that made Lake Madison a cherished gathering place.

Like many Chautauquas across the country, the Lake Madison assembly struggled during the Great Depression. Financial challenges eventually brought the tradition to an end after the 1933 season. Although the buildings and crowds have long since disappeared, the Chautauqua left a lasting mark on the community.

It helped introduce thousands of people to Lake Madison and established the lake as a destination for recreation, relaxation, and lifelong memories. In many ways, the spirit of the Chautauqua lives on today. Every summer, families continue to gather along these same shores to reconnect, enjoy the outdoors, and create new traditions—just as visitors did more than 130 years ago.

Did You Know....

The Lake Madison Chautauqua operated for 42 years.

A narrow-gauge railroad carried visitors from Madison directly to the Chautauqua grounds.

The Chautauqua helped establish Lake Madison as one of South Dakota's earliest and most popular summer vacation destinations.



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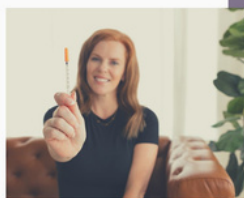
