### Our Mission

At Antioch Baptist Church, we believe every member is called to share the gospel. "Fill the Jar - Fulfill the Mission" is our practical approach to personal evangelism that helps us track our commitment to reaching others with Christ's love.

---

### How It Works

**Three colored balls represent different aspects of evangelism:**

● **BLUE BALL** = Non-believer you commit to pray for each month

- Add a blue ball for each person you're specifically praying for
- Commit their name and needs to God regularly

● **RED BALL** = Gospel conversation you have

- Add a red ball each time you share the gospel with someone
- This could be a full presentation or planting seeds of faith

○ **WHITE BALL** = Person who says yes to Jesus

- Add a white ball when someone accepts Christ
- Celebrate these victories with the church family

## Our Congregation Goals

### Every member commits to:

- Pray for at least **1 non-believer** per month
- Have at least **1 gospel conversation** each month

---

## Equipping & Encouragement

### Monthly Support:

- Evangelism tips shared during worship services
- Testimony sharing to encourage one another

**Remember:** God calls us to be faithful in sharing - He handles the results. Whether someone says yes immediately or needs more time, every prayer and conversation plants seeds for the Kingdom.

## Getting Started

1. **Pray** - Ask God to bring specific people to mind
2. **Commit** - Add blue balls for those you'll pray for regularly
3. **Share** - Look for opportunities to have gospel conversations
4. **Celebrate** - Add red and white balls as God opens doors
