Psalm 51

- L: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my offense, Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!
- R: For I know my offenses, and my sin is ever before me. Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done that which is evil in your sight.
- L: That you are justified in your sentence and blameless in your judgement. Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me.

Psalm 147: 12-20

(Repeat antiphon after Leader)

Ant: We worship your cross, O Lord, and we praise and glorify your holy resurrections, for the wood of the cross has brought joy to the world.

L: Praise the Lord, O Jerusalem! Praise your God, O Zion!

- R: For he strengthens the bars of your gates; he blesses your children within you. He grants peace within your borders; he fills you with the finest of wheat.
- L: She sends out his command to the earth; her word runs swiftly, She gives snow like wool; she scatters frost like ashes.
- R: He hurls down hail like crumbs---who can stand before his cold? He sends out his work, and melts them; he makes his wind blow, and the waters flow.
- L: She declares her work to Jacob, her statutes and ordinances to Israel. She has not dealt thus with any other nation; they do not know her ordinances. Praise the Lord!

Psalm Prayer

Lord, you establish peace within the borders of Jerusalem. Give the fullness of peace now to your faithful people. May peace rule us in this life and possess us in eternal life. You are about to fill us with the best of wheat; grant that what we see dimly now as a mirror, we may come to perceive clearly in the brightness of your truth.

(antiphon all together)

Ant: We worship your cross, O Lord, and we praise and glorify your holy resurrection, for the wood of the cross has brought joy to the world.

Reading: Hebrews 9: 11-28

But when Christ came as a high priest of the good things that have come, then through the greater and perfect tent (not made with hands, that is, not of this creation), he entered once for all into the Holy Place, not with the blood of goats and calves, but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls, with the sprinkling of the ashes of a heifer, sanctifies those who have been defiled so that their flesh is purified, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without blemish to God, purify our conscience from dead works to worship the living God! For this reason he is the mediator of a new covenant, so that those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance, because a death has occurred that redeems them from the transgressions under the first covenant, where a will is involved, the death of the one who made it must be established. For a will takes effect only at death, since it is not in force as long as the one who made it is alive.

Hence not even the first covenant was inaugurated without blood. For when every commandment had been told to all the people by Moses in accordance with the law, he took the blood of calves and goats, with water and scarlet wool and hyssop, and sprinkled both the scroll itself and all the people, saying, "This is the blood of the covenant that God has ordained for you." And in the same way he sprinkled with the blood both the tent and all the vessels used in

worship. Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins. Thus it was necessary for the sketches of the heavenly things to be purified with these rites, but the heavenly things themselves need better sacrificed than these. For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself, And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgment, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

The heavens are telling the glory of God, and all creation I shouting for joy. Come, dance in the forest, come play in the field and sing, sing, to the glory of the Lord. (Last time: Sing, sing to the glory of the Lord!
