DAY 1 Saturday, July 31: Depart for Ireland

Depart Washington Dulles International Airport for Ireland. Complimentary dinner (D), breakfast (B), and beverages will be served on board the transatlantic flight.

DAY 2 Sunday, August 1: Welcome to Dublin! | Guinness Storehouse

Arrive at Dublin Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet our Peter's Way tour manager as we exit from Customs. Board our private touring bus and we will be on our way to Dublin City. Enjoy a panoramic city tour by coach. Discover the north and south side of the River Liffey. This area offers great striking monuments such as the GPO (General Post Office) on the city main thoroughfare, O'Connell Street, the Custom House along the quays, and Phoenix Park, the largest public park in Europe. Continue our orientation tour to the south side, which appears more sophisticated with its vast Georgian squares like Merrion Square, where Oscar Wilde's House can still be found (today owned by an American College). We'll see Grafton Street with its quality shops. Not so far from St. Stephen's Green on Kildare Street, we will see the house of Bram Stoker, the author of *Dracula*. **Attend Sunday Mass at the Church of Our Lady of Lourdes in Dublin.** Independent lunch.

Enjoy a visit to the Guinness Storehouse. Located in the heart of St. James's Gate, the Guinness Storehouse was once the old fermentation plant of the brewery where today, you can experience the history, heart, and soul of Ireland's most iconic beer. Discover what makes the brewing process so special, hear about the history of the brewery, and enjoy a pint at the Gravity Bar. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Dublin. (B,D)

DAY 3 Monday, August 2: Dublin | Trinity College | Concert at St. Patrick's Cathedral

Irish breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with a visit to Trinity College to view *The Book of Kells*, an 8th-century illustrated manuscript permanently exhibited in the Old Library of Trinity College. Continue to St. Patrick's Cathedral, a place of spiritual encounter for countless generations. A guided visit will introduce us to its history, its place in the life of the city, and its long tradition of worship. **Lunchtime 30-minute concert at St. Patrick's Cathedral, presented by the Church of the Redeemer Choir.**

Independent lunch and free afternoon to enjoy Dublin on our own. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Dublin. (B,D)

DAY 4 Tuesday, August 3: Clonmacnoise | Knock Shrine

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll depart Dublin for County Mayo. En route we'll visit Clonmacnoise, located at an ancient crossroads where the Esker Way and the River Shannon meet. Clonmacnoise was a monastery founded by St. Ciaran in the 6th century, a place of religious learning, and a place of pilgrimage, renowned for its literary and artistic achievements that enjoyed the patronage of Kings and Chieftains. It was home to three exceptional high crosses, a cathedral, seven churches, and two round towers. Independent lunch.

We'll visit Ireland's National Marian Shrine in Knock. The story of Knock began on the evening of August 21, 1879, when the Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, and St. John the Evangelist appeared at the south gable of the church at Knock. Beside them was an altar with a cross and the figure of a lamb, around which angels hovered. There were fifteen official witnesses to the apparition who watched and prayed for two hours in the pouring rain. The special message of Knock is the need for penance. **Celebrate 3:00 p.m. scheduled Mass and blessing of the sick at the Basilica of Knock, sung by the Church of the Redeemer Choir.** Check-in at our hotel in Knock.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Knock. (B,D)

DAY 5 Wednesday, August 4: Connemara | Kylemore Abbey | Galway

Irish breakfast at our hotel. Today we'll drive through Connemara, a land of lakes and rivers, bogs, and mountains, where Gaelic is still the spoken language. Visit the village of Cong, where John Ford's great movie, *The Quiet Man*, starring John Wayne, Maureen O'Hara, and Barry Fitzgerald, was primarily filmed. Continue to Kylemore Abbey for a visit. Mitchell Henry built the house in 1868 after having spent his honeymoon in the area. The architecture is best described as neo-gothic, and the house still displays all the characteristics of that period. One of Kylemore Abbey's most famous features is its miniature cathedral, built in 1870 and known locally as the Gothic church. Today, the abbey is home to the Irish order of Benedictine nuns. They established a private school for young girls, which was the renowned Kylemore Abbey International School. The school eventually closed in 2010. Facilities at Kylemore include a visitor center, an exhibition housed in the main reception rooms of the house, and a video that takes the visitor through the history of the house and its occupants. The Gothic church is available to visit and as a venue for choir groups to sing in. If time allows, guests can also visit the Kylemore Abbey Victorian Walled Garden, laid out in 1867. **Lunchtime 30-minute concert at the Gothic Church of Kylemore Abbey, presented by the Church of the Redeemer Choir.** Independent lunch. After lunch, we'll continue to Galway for hotel check-in. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Galway. (B,D)

DAY 6 Thursday, August 5: Burren Region | Cliffs of Moher | Limerick

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Galway and drive through the most spectacular Burren Region. The area got its name from its polished limestone landscape ("*Boirean*" is the Irish word for rocky). The region was largely sculpted over the last two million years by glaciers, through the exposure and submergence of its landscape to ice, ocean, and the plate movements of the earth. The whole area, with its flora and fauna, is heaven for geologists and botanists. We will stop at the Cliffs of Moher, the most majestic cliffs in Ireland that rise over 700 feet from the Atlantic Ocean and extend for over four miles. From this height, admire the Aran Islands and the Connemara Mountains, and listen to the many sea birds that colonize this place from springtime on. Independent lunch. We'll continue to Limerick for hotel check-in.

Enjoy a medieval banquet at Bunratty Folk Park Castle. The world-famous medieval banquet is a testament to the cultural and social life of its former inhabitants. The ladies of the castle, aided and abetted by the Earl's butler, ensure an evening of entertainment, which follows in the best tradition of Irish hospitality. The wine flows as the entertainers recreate the magical atmosphere of the Earl's banquet through drama, music, and song. Overnight at our hotel in Limerick. (B,D)

DAY 7 Friday, August 6: Dingle Peninsula | Killarney

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, head south through the Dingle Peninsula, one of Ireland's most popular coastal scenery drives. Dingle is the most northern of the Kerry peninsulas. This peninsula is famous for its Celtic, pre-Christian monuments and Christian churches. It is also a "Gaeltacht" (Irish-speaking) area, where the Irish language and traditional ways of life are preserved. Dingle town itself is a thriving fishing town and offers plenty of opportunity for shopping or simply savoring the atmosphere of a typical country Irish town with its plentiful pubs, narrow streets, and busy harbor. Independent lunch.

Continue the road around the Dingle Peninsula and pass through a chain of mountains, called Slieve Mish. From Inch, a long beach bordered by dunes and made famous by David Lean's movie *Ryan's Daughter*, admire the Iveragh Peninsula and Rossbeigh Beach. Drive around the coast to Slea Head. Here, the blue of the marine landscape surrounds the Basket Islands, deserted since 1953. In the distance are the two rocky Skellig islands, where the ruins of an early Christian Monastery can be found. The Dingle Peninsula will charm you with its villages painted in bright colors and bewitch you with the dramatic beauty of its landscapes. We will visit Gallarus Oratory. Gallarus Oratory is the most impressive early Christian monument on the Dingle peninsula. It has withstood the passage of time for over 1,200 years. Built in the shape of an upturned boat, the oratory formed part of a larger monastic site used as a place of prayer and reflection. **Continue to the Church of St. Brendan's in Cloghane for the 3:00 p.m. Mass, performed by the Church of the Redeemer Choir.** Dinner at O'Connor's Bar & Restaurant.

Afterward, we'll continue to Killarney for hotel check-in. Overnight at our hotel in Killarney. (B,D)

DAY 8 Saturday, August 7: Muckross House | Killarney National Park

Irish breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with a scenic drive through the Ring of Kerry. Continue to Muckross House and Gardens, a magnificent Victorian mansion built in 1843 and one of Ireland's leading stately homes. Built on the shores of Muckross Lake, it is beautifully situated amidst the spectacular scenery of Killarney National Park. The elegantly furnished rooms portray the lifestyle of the landed gentry, while downstairs in the basement one can experience the working conditions of the servants employed in the house. The gardens of Muckross House are famed for their beauty worldwide. In particular they are noted for their collections of azaleas and rhododendrons. The extensive water garden, children's sunken garden, and outstanding rock garden, hewn out of natural limestone, are just some of the features to be discovered. Independent lunch.

Enjoy free time in Killarney, with its quaint and colorful streetscapes. **Attend 6:15 p.m. Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral in Killarney.** Independent dinner. Overnight at our hotel in Killarney. (B)

DAY 9 Sunday, August 8: Blarney Castle | Dublin

Irish breakfast at our hotel. This morning, depart for County Cork to visit Blarney Castle (*2-hour drive*), where you will feel compelled to kiss the Blarney Stone and gain the gift of eloquence, or as an 18th century French consul put it, to "gain the privilege of telling lies for seven years." The castle itself, a tower house, dates from 1446 and is built on solid limestone. Stop for an independent lunch with time for shopping at Blarney Woolen Mills, which sells high quality Irish crafts.

We'll continue to Dublin (*2-hour drive*). Check-in at our hotel and freshen up for dinner. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Dublin. (B,D)

DAY 10 Monday, August 9: Return from Dublin

After breakfast at our hotel, we'll be transferred by coach to Dublin Airport for our return flight home. (B)

Acceptance of these Terms & Conditions, with signature on enrollment form, is required for participation in this tour.

PAYMENT: All payments will be accepted in the form of check, money order, or debit/credit card. **Peter's Way Tours (PWT)** reserves the right to increase the package price or reduce services should there be an escalation in the Euro valuation over the U.S. Dollar in excess of 3% from print date. If a final payment is not received by the balance deadline, PWT reserves the right to cancel your reservation. A \$50.00 late fee and possible increase in airfare may apply for late payments. Travel insurance is recommended as protection for cancellations due to medical reasons (illness or injury). Travel insurance payments are non-refundable. Tour participation is non-transferable. Names cannot be changed on roster or airline tickets. All refund requests are subject to cancellation terms set forth above. Costs for tour services that are not utilized are non-refundable. We strongly recommend purchasing travel insurance in order to protect your tour package investment. Please read all details very carefully under TRAVEL INSURANCE.

LATE RESERVATIONS: Enrollments received after the deposit deadline are subject to confirmation. Late fees and a possible increase in airfare may apply.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: Each traveler is solely responsible for carrying a valid passport and ascertaining knowledge of current entry/exit requirements. **U.S. Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months after the return date.** Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current international travel requirements. Beginning in late 2026, visitors to the European Union may require additional travel documents to enter the EU. After enrolling you will be sent information to apply online for ETIAS prior to travel (if required). Each traveler is solely responsible for ensuring that all required travel documents are complete and current. PWT will not be held responsible for a passenger's lack of current and valid entry documents (i.e., passport, proof of vaccine, any required test results).

AIR TRANSPORTATION: This travel package includes round-trip estimated economy class airfare from Dulles. Rates will be confirmed 11 months prior to departure. Flight itinerary and carrier may be subject to change. Estimated departure taxes & fuel surcharges are subject to increase prior to ticketing. All flights are booked under one itinerary. If a traveler does not travel on any one of the flights in the proper sequence, the rest of the reservation will be automatically canceled by the airline. Rebooking the canceled flight would be subject to a change fee and possible fare difference. If you purchase independent flights, PWT will not be held responsible for the cost(s) if you cancel participation for any reason. **It is important that you do not purchase airline tickets until the group has been confirmed for travel by PWT.**

AIRLINE SEATING: Under group contracts, seat selection is not permitted. Requests for seat preferences (window or aisle) may be made when you check in for the flight. Group reservations may not be accessed online for advance check-in/boarding passes/seat assignments. If seat selection is a condition that affects your decision to travel, it is suggested that you purchase the land only package in order to book your airline arrangements according to your specific needs.

LAND ONLY PASSENGERS: The Land Only package price is \$3,895.00 per person sharing a twin room (\$200 cash discount will be applied if all payments are made by check). The Land Only package does not include group airfare. It is the traveler's responsibility to book airline tickets independently. Any tour participant may change their status to "Land Only" by notifying PWT in writing, up to 100 days prior to departure. Passenger(s) opting for the Land Only package, or deviating from the group itinerary, are responsible for their own transfers to/from the hotel/airport. However, if your flights coordinate with the groups' arrangements, you are welcome to utilize the group transfer(s). **If you purchase your own airline transportation and the group does not materialize or you cancel for any reason, PWT will not be held responsible for the cost of your airfare.**

DEVIATIONS & ITINERARY CHANGES: PWT is pleased to assist clients with special requests. Deviation requests must be submitted in writing at least 100 days prior to departure. TRANSFERS AND PORTERAGE: Overseas round-trip airport transfers are included for passengers who purchase the full air and land package for the group tour dates. Portage of one piece of luggage at hotels throughout your tour is included. Peter's Way Tours cannot be held liable for any misplaced or lost luggage. It is the passenger's responsibility to make sure their luggage travels with them the entirety of the trip.

ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS: The package price is based on double occupancy (two twin beds). Married couples may request a double bed which is subject to availability. Triple rooms (two twin beds plus rollaway) may be requested, with no discount for triple occupancy. Single rooms may be requested at time of booking. Single rooms are limited, subject to confirmation, may be smaller, and located apart from the room block. **If a single room is confirmed, an additional charge of \$1,195.00 will apply.** We cannot guarantee roommate requests but will make every effort to pair you with another traveler, if double occupancy is requested. If a single room must be assigned due to lack of a traveler to pair you with, a roommate's cancellation, incompatibility, or any other reason (at the last moment or while on tour), you will be charged the single supplement.

MEALS: Irish breakfast daily plus seven (7) dinners as per itinerary, including a traditional Irish Medieval banquet at Bunnratty Folk Park Castle Coach.

GRATUITIES & SERVICE CHARGES: Gratuities are not included in your tour package. Although voluntary, for good work we recommend \$8.00 per person per day for your

tour manager; \$5.00 per person per day for your bus driver; and \$2.00 per tour for local guides. Tips for your tour manager and bus driver are normally given as a group at the end of the tour. All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the package price. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave \$1.00 per person for the wait staff after each meal and \$1.00 per person per day for housekeeping. **(For tips, USD is accepted however local currency is preferred).**
