

A New Face for Redeemer By Alec McGuire

It is an exciting time to be at Redeemer! At the precipice of the 50th anniversary of Redeemer's founding, the parish now has a completely new brand identity. I would like to thank Chris Lewis of Baritus Catholic who did phenomenal work for our rebranding project.

The Redeemer icon consists of Christ holding his cross, the instrument of his redemptive act. His right hand gesture signifies two realities: First, the two joined fingers denote the hypostatic union of Christ's two natures: divine and human; Second, the three raised fingers refer to the three divine persons of the Holy Trinity.

The parish color palette consists of five colors. The primary colors are evergreen, gold, and white with black and wheat as the secondary color group. A style guide for the parish features all the branding assets of the parish, size guidelines, and use violations. Over the month of November, the parish will be updating its digital and physical platforms including: the parish website, bulletin, Facebook, YouTube, Flocknote, and Good News!

St. Gertrude's Prayer








Pilgrimage to National Shrine By Sonia Garcia

Redeemer Parishioners on a Marian Pilgrimage – A Journey of Faith By Diane Atkins

Pilgrimages are a beautiful way to grow in faith, to seek solace, and community. Six Redeemer parishioners recently did just that—on a Marian Pilgrimage through France, Spain, and Portugal led by our very own Spiritual Director, Deacon Chris Malone! It was beautiful to participate in daily prayer led by Deacon Chris accompanied by the joyful voice of Cindy—what a blessing!



The trip began in Lourdes, France, where Our Lady appeared to St. Bernadette, proclaiming herself the "Immaculate Conception." They were blessed to attend Mass at the Grotto of Massabielle, where the Virgin Mary appeared 18 times. Everyone especially loved participating in the Candlelight Procession and praying the Rosary with thousands of other Catholics from around the world. Maybe you spotted them on EWTN?

While in Spain, the group took a cable car way up into the mountains to visit the Black Madonna of Montserrat, an awe inspiring devotion to the Blessed Mother located in a Benedictine Monastery. Time to light a candle and pray for loved ones back home made this spot on top of the world truly a blessing for all.

The travelers visited Barcelona (and the magnificent Gaudi's La Sagrada Familia), made time for a quick dip in the Mediterranean Sea, then on to Zaragoza where Mary appeared to St. James—and he prayed, through Mary's intercession, for those who suffer misfortune, those who suffer from loneliness, ignorance, or hunger. May we all be blessed like St. James to feel Mary's love and receive encouragement to grow our faith and lead a life of service to others.

As the journey continued, the group made their way to Fatima, Portugal, one of the most well-known Marian Shrines. Here, Mary appeared times six before three peasant children near the village in 1917. The group was able to stand in the spot where, in October 1917, over 70,000 people witnessed the Miracle of the Sun. Deacon Chris celebrated Mass on that very spot. Wow! The group was greatly moved by a visit to the Church of St. Stephen (Church of the Holy Miracle), which contains the oldest recorded Eucharistic Miracle, which has been on continuous display since 1269.

All this happened, and of course, so much more! All of the pilgrims returned to Virginia and Redeemer, a little bit changed. Transformed by the beauty of the countries visited, by the faith of our friends (both new and old), by the sacred stories of our Mother Mary, and by the hallowed time shared in daily prayer, Mass, and Eucharist.



No Room at the Inn: Helping Our Neighbors Near and Far

Redeemer's No Room at the Inn weekend is just a month away and there are many ways you can participate in this annual event that helps our neighbors near and far who are experiencing housing insecurity. This year's beneficiaries are Mechanicsville Churches Emergency Functions (MCEF), Moments of Hope, and Redeemer's Haiti ministry. Since 2008, the event has raised more than \$366,000.

The weekend begins Friday, December 1 with a preview gala and continues Saturday and Sunday with an opportunity to view 200 nativities from around the world and participate in fun activities in the family room.

November 18-19: A new beneficiary this year, Moments of Hope Outreach, will be speaking at all three weekend Masses to tell us about their work in Hanover and greater Richmond. Tickets will be on sale after all Masses for our famous Diamond in a Box raffle, a beautiful nativity from Fatima, and for the Gala. This year's diamond is a bracelet worth \$900 donated by Diamonds Direct.

November 19: Deadline to submit this form to loan a nativity for the display.

November 24: You can start your Black Friday shopping at the No Room online Auction redeemerva.schoolauction.net/noroom2023/. Bidding will conclude at 10:00 p.m. on December 1.

November 25-26: Tickets will be on sale after all Masses for our famous Diamond in a Box raffle (\$25), a beautiful nativity from Lourdes (\$1 each or 6 for \$5), and for the Gala (\$30).

December 1: 7:00-10:00 p.m. No Room Preview Gala! Tickets are \$30 in advance; \$35 at the door. Amazing food and spirits, silent and live auctions complement the 200 nativities.

December 2: 10:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. Nativity display and family room open. Tickets are \$5 for adults, \$1 for 18 and under.

December 3: 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. Nativity display and family room open. Tickets are \$5 for adults, \$1 for 18 and under.
