

The Lighting of the Advent Wreath Candles


Children's Chapel Ministry

All stand as able and remain standing. The Children's Chapel representative greets the people with these words

Leader: Light and peace, in Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

The appropriate candle(s) on the Advent Wreath are lighted (two blue and one pink candle) as the Children's Chapel representative reads the story that the children will learn about and discuss together later today.



1. As we light the third Advent candle, we imagine a world bubbling with joy. Joy is when you feel so thankful you could burst with excitement and gratitude. When Elizabeth learned her cousin Mary was pregnant, she could barely contain her excitement.



2. Elizabeth was also pregnant, and had been for a while, so she understood the confusion and surprise Mary was feeling. When Mary arrived at Elizabeth's home, Mary was greeted with overflowing joy and excitement. Even the baby in Elizabeth's womb started kicking and somersaulting!



3. "Mary, blessed are you among all who mother!" Elizabeth cried. "And blessed is the baby growing inside you!" Mary—feeling seen, loved, and safe—burst into joyful song. "God is changing the world through this baby, and I get to help!"



4. "God throws the powerful from their thrones and lifts up all who were pushed down. God feeds all who are hungry and sends the rich away with nothing. God is making all things right; God has not forgotten us!"







A Reading from the Epistle to the James:



Elliott, Edna, Jean, Maurice and Al; for the students and staff of Rainbow Road Preschool; for victims of gun violence and their families; for the unemployed and underemployed; for families who gather during this holiday season and for those who travel, including Edmund Warburton; for Trinity's organizational partners in ministry and mission, and for those we name aloud or in the silence of our hearts. 
People It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Because you sent your beloved Son to redeem us from sin and death, and to make us heirs in him of everlasting life; that when he shall come again in power and great triumph to judge the world, we may without shame or fear rejoice to behold his appearing.

Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:



The people stand or kneel. Then the Celebrant continues

[Kneeling as we are able and so desire, we continue to pray.] We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing the wine to be consecrated.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

We proclaim his resurrection.

We await his coming in glory;

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.



Communion of the People of God

All are welcome to come to the Altar to receive Holy Communion or a blessing from our clergy. You may receive the wine either with the bread by intinction or from the chalice directly. If you are baptized and/or receive Communion in your home church, you may receive Communion at Trinity. 




