For those who belonged to the community of the faithful on earth, and who now reside in God's eternal kingdom, especially David Smith and Jerry Riley, former Rector of Trinity Church, let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

For whom and what else shall we pray today?

The People may add their own petitions, silently or aloud.

We pray for Sean, our Presiding Bishop; Mark, Gayle, and Mark, our bishops; for Kim our priest, and Elliott our assisting priest; for all who are ministers at Trinity by Holy Baptism; and for all bishops and other ministers, that they may be faithful ministers of your Word and Sacraments.

We pray also for Donald, our president, and Glenn, our governor, that you will grant them the wisdom and strength to know and to do your will; and make them ever mindful of their calling to serve the people of this nation in your fear, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

O God, who created all peoples in your image, we thank you for the wonderful diversity of races and cultures you have created. Enrich our lives by ever-widening circles of fellowship and show us your presence in those who differ most from us, until our knowledge of your love is made perfect in our love for all your children, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

We pray for all nations, peoples, and tribes throughout the world, remembering especially all who have asked us for prayers, including the family and friends of Adrian Hanley, Jerry Riley, David Smith and all who mourn; the under or unemployed; the medically vulnerable; those experiencing homelessness as well as food insecurity; victims of gun violence; and people around the world facing strife and war, including those in Gaza, Israel, Iran, Ukraine, Russia, Haiti, and South Sudan.







The people stand or kneel. Then the Celebrant continues:

[Kneeling or standing as we are able and so desire, we continue to pray.] And so, Father, we who have been redeemed by him, and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring before you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a hand upon it, and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

On the night he was betrayed he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Remembering now his work of redemption, and offering to you this sacrifice of thanksgiving, We celebrate his death and resurrection, as we await the day of his coming.

Lord God of our Fathers: God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ: Open our eyes to see your hand at work in the world about us. Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this Table for solace only, and not for strength; for pardon only, and not for renewal. Let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in his name.

Risen Lord, be known to us in the breaking of the Bread.

Accept these prayers and praises, Father, through Jesus Christ our great High Priest, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, your Church gives honor, glory, and worship, from generation to generation. **AMEN.**






