

GENERAL INFORMATION

NEW PARISHIONERS: WELCOME! Please register in the parish office or on our parish website.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Complete the Baptismal Registration Form online. Baptisms are held on the last weekend of the month (no Baptism during Lent and the month of December).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Contact the office at least one year before your wedding to schedule marriage preparation sessions. Marriage Requirements and Guidelines are intended to prepare you for the Sacrament of Marriage.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT THE HOSPITAL: Ask the patient's nurse to request a Catholic priest for Anointing of the Sick. The priest on-call will be contacted.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK IN CHURCH: St. Anthony Church holds Evening Prayer with Anointing of the Sick on the last Thursday of the odd number months.

HOLY COMMUNION & ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT HOME: Call the parish office to request an appointment.

FUNERALS: Notify our parish office FIRST—before confirming funeral arrangements with the mortuary. Family will meet with Parochial Vicar to plan Funeral Mass or prayer service.

MASS INTENTIONS: Mass Intentions are confirmed in the parish office one week before the requested date. Mass Intentions are read only at the 7:00 a.m. Mass / Monday through Saturday.

HOUSE BLESSINGS: Contact the parish office for an appointment.

BLESSING OF CARS & RELIGIOUS ARTICLES: Cars are blessed only after the Mass. To bless religious articles, approach the priest after any Mass for a blessing.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection

Readings: Wisdom 18:6-9. Psalm 33: 1, 12, 18-19, 20-22. Hebrews 11: 1-2, 8-19. Luke 12: 32-48.

Summer vacation offers a chance to get away, to enjoy a change of pace from other pressing concerns. Opening the Word today reveals how looking forward in hope can change all time to our benefit.

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus offers a simple story by which to implore His disciples to be attentive to the impending future. Typically, servants whose master has gone away will enjoy the freedom of the present by taking some time off. In doing so, they risk forgetting that their primary responsibility – doing the master's will – still requires their attentiveness. What the master desires does not cease simply because he is absent.

Vigilance is always needed to counterattack the natural propensity to slack off whenever possible. Intentional actions, like girding loins and lighting lamps, serve the worthwhile purpose of remaining "ready to open the door immediately" upon the master's return.


Readiness in waiting changes the dynamic of time. It makes the future already present to those attentive to what is foreseen. In turn, as Jesus tells the story, it can lead to a change in relationship. The servants are "blessed" when the master acknowledges their responsible foresight and reverses roles with them: he waiting on them, instead of vice versa, as a reward for their knowing how to act in his absence.

The fictional story in the Gospel dramatizes the real-life history behind today's first reading. The ancient people hoping for salvation (from slavery in Egypt) could not have known beforehand the time or manner in which they would be freed from their adversaries. But they already knew the God who promised it to them and that faith sufficed to give them courage to wait for it. Awaiting what they were sure would take place, they come to experience the "divine institution" of the Passover. Wisdom appreciates the value of patient fidelity.

Even farther back in salvation history, Abraham serves as a "well attested" model of hopefulness in today's second reading. His faith enabled him to perceive the attainment of the future good that God had promised. He obeyed and "went out," though he knew not "where he was to go." He entered "the promised land," though it was "a foreign country" to him. He generated progeny, though "he was past the normal age." All this because he confidently "thought that the One who had made the promise was trustworthy."

A faithful patriarch, a patient people, a vigilant servant – all are "blessed" because "the Lord has chosen" them (responsorial psalm) and because they chose to hope in Him whose promise never fails – even if or when He seems absent.

We, too, can be blessed by hoping in the One we already know - "Jesus Christ, who is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).

EMBRACING OUR IMPERFECTION The Law Is Insufficient

Wednesday, July 30, 2025

Richard Rohr explains the necessity of moving beyond a relationship with God that is based on morality and law:

Religion is ultimately not a moral matter; it's a mystical matter. While most of us begin focused on moral proficiency and perfection, we can't spend our whole lives this way. Paul calls this first-half-of-life approach "the law"; I call it the performance principle. We think, "I'm good because I obey this commandment, because I do this kind of work, or because I belong to this group." That's the calculus the ego understands. The human psyche, all organizations, and governments need this kind of common-sense structure at some level. But that game has to fall apart, or it will kill us. Paul says the law leads to death (see Romans 7:5; Galatians 3:10). Yet many Christians are still trapped inside the law, believing that by doing the right things, they're going to somehow attain worthiness or acceptance from God. The ways in which we've defined ourselves as successful, moral, right, good, on top of it, number one ... have to fail us! [1]

Pastor Juanita Campbell Rasmus describes how having a rules-based approach to religion left her feeling hollow and out of touch with God's love:

As a child, rules kept me safe from judgment and harm, safe from breaking any of God's do-not-cross-this-line rules. I thought the rules worked: I didn't drink, I didn't smoke, I didn't steal, I didn't gamble, I didn't ... and so on, my little checklist of righteousness went. And yet I was aware that my life had a certain quality of hollowness to it....

Understanding began to come to me one day while I was lying on the sofa in the living room... The room was filled with the warm midday sun. As I lay there, the Lord said, You have built a life filled with rules. Your rules have boxed you in, and they have boxed me out.

I didn't get it. Wasn't the God-life all about following rules? Isn't Christianity rooted in Thou shalt not? Had I gotten what it meant to be a Christian totally wrong? If it wasn't about the rules, then what had I wasted my time and life doing all these years? And if I had gotten this all wrong, what else had I gotten wrong about God? Even more, what would it take to get it right?...

Rules alone had left me hollow inside, but the sense that the Spirit was freeing me to be in relationship was so life-giving that all I could call it was joy. Something about this new awareness began to fill some of the emptiness that I had been feeling.... I have found that relationship with God and my practice of abiding with God, being joined with God, are what make me solid inside and out.... Perhaps the word love best describes what seemed to be flowing into me; yes, a deep knowing that I was loved. [2]
