

GENERAL INFORMATION

NEW PARISHIONERS: WELCOME! Please register in the parish office or on our parish website.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Complete the Baptismal Registration Form online. Baptisms are held on the last weekend of the month (no Baptism during Lent and the month of December).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Contact the office at least one year before your wedding to schedule marriage preparation sessions. Marriage Requirements and Guidelines are intended to prepare you for the Sacrament of Marriage.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT THE HOSPITAL: Ask the patient's nurse to request a Catholic priest for Anointing of the Sick. The priest on-call will be contacted.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK IN CHURCH: St. Anthony Church holds Evening Prayer with Anointing of the Sick on the last Thursday of the odd number months.

HOLY COMMUNION & ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT HOME: Call the parish office to request an appointment.

FUNERALS: Notify our parish office FIRST—before confirming funeral arrangements with the mortuary. Family will meet with Parochial Vicar to plan Funeral Mass or prayer service.

MASS INTENTIONS: Mass Intentions are confirmed in the parish office one week before the requested date. Mass Intentions are read only at the 7:00 a.m. Mass / Monday through Saturday.

HOUSE BLESSINGS: Contact the parish office for an appointment.

BLESSING OF CARS & RELIGIOUS ARTICLES: Cars are blessed only after the Mass. To bless religious articles, approach the priest after any Mass for a blessing.



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection

Readings: Jeremiah 38: 4-6, 8-10. Psalm 40: 2, 3, 4, 18. Hebrews 12: 1-4. Luke 12: 49-53.

After celebrating hope fulfilled in Mary's assumption, the less glorious realities of life on Earth come back into focus. Opening the Word today discloses how hope is always needed.

Today's first reading describes the menacing prospect of power gone mad. Jeremiah has called for Judah to surrender to its dominant foes so as to survive its latest conflict. The country's princes – who stand to lose their prestige - consider "speaking such things" a treasonous act, one intent on weakening the resolve of ("demoralizing") Jerusalem's defenders and bringing the entire people to ruin. They consign the prophet to a slow death, lowering him into a cistern to sink in the mud. Fortunately, a servant of the king, Ebed-melech, convinces the sovereign to relent; he then leads a team to recover Jeremiah before he dies.


With no way out of the cistern, Jeremiah's only hope lay elsewhere — in Him whom today's responsorial psalm extols: He "waited for the Lord" to "hear" his cry," and the Lord did "come to his aid." As a result, the prophet's personal saga and his enduring prophecy become a sign for others to "look on in awe and to trust in the Lord."

The destructive picture in today's Gospel seems, at first, to contradict that psalm. Evoking the Old Testament image of eschatological judgment, Jesus characterizes His mission as setting the Earth ablaze with fire. In the process, He, too, suffers "anguish" over the project of His whole life - to be baptized unto death as a catalyst for conversion. He avows that such change requires destruction of old ways to make space for new life. Like a generational conflict in families, that purifying process will prove painful. Hope of salvation enables working through it.

That prospect is realized in the Paschal Mystery of Jesus, as we hear in today's second reading from Hebrews. Divided from His own family of faith ("opposition from sinners") and branded as a criminal (the "shame" of the Cross), Jesus knew that only by undergoing the Baptism that entailed "shedding" His own blood could He defeat the struggle against sin. He endured it all "for the sake of the joy that lay before Him," not only His own (in taking a "seat at the right hand of God"), but also for the joy of perfecting the faith of those who follow Him.

Stuck in the mud, set ablaze by severe trials, struggling through a lifelong race - our existence in this world comes with few prospects for peace. How easy it can be to "grow weary and lose heart."

Yet with hope can we endure all things because of Him who comes to our aid by ridding us of the burden of sin through His redeeming death on the cross.


