

NEW PARISHIONERS: WELCOME!
Please register in the parish office or on our parish website.

**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** Complete the Baptismal Registration Form online. Baptisms are held on the last weekend of the month (no Baptism during Lent and the month of December).

**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY:** Contact the office at least one year before your wedding to schedule marriage preparation sessions. Marriage Requirements and Guidelines are intended to prepare you for the Sacrament of Marriage.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT THE HOSPITAL:** Ask the patient's nurse to request a Catholic priest for Anointing of the Sick. The priest on-call will be contacted.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK IN CHURCH:** St. Anthony Church holds Evening Prayer with Anointing of the Sick on the last Thursday of the odd number months.

**HOLY COMMUNION & ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT HOME:** Call the parish office to request an appointment.

**FUNERALS:** Notify our parish office FIRST—before confirming funeral arrangements with the mortuary. Family will meet with Parochial Vicar to plan Funeral Mass or prayer service.

MASS INTENTIONS: Mass Intentions are confirmed in the parish office one week before the requested date. Mass Intentions are read only at the 7:00 a.m. Mass / Monday through Saturday.

**HOUSE BLESSINGS:** Contact the parish office for an appointment.

**BLESSING OF CARS & RELIGIOUS ARTICLES:** Cars are blessed only after the Mass. To bless religious articles, approach the priest after any Mass for a blessing.





#### **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

#### **Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection**

Readings: Isaiah 66: 18-21. Psalm 117: 1, 2. Hebrews 12: 5-7, 11-13. Luke 13: 22-30.

As summer wanes, a return to the rat race of every day life looms ahead. Opening the Word today, we hear another exhortation to approach it with hope.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is "making His way to Jerusalem," where His agonizing death looms large. Someone inquires about the prospects of salvation: Would it be for all or only a few? To the Master, a number is not the issue; urgent effort matters much more.

"Strive," the Teacher says, "to enter through the narrow gate." The imagery recalls the gate to the sacred city of Jerusalem. When closed, it affords only one person at a time access through a small passageway. One cannot get through it simply by tagging along ("we ate and drank in Your company") or by mere association ("you taught in our streets"). Entry is possible only through a determined decision and the personal effort ("striving") it takes to follow Him. For those who do, no matter their origins (the four directions alluding to Gentile lands), the salvific rest they seek ("reclining at table") awaits them.

In today's second reading, the striving that Jesus teaches as necessary for salvation comes into focus as a matter of "discipline." The passage from Hebrews urges believers to shape up ("strengthen your drooping hands and your weak knees") and "endure your trials" as a matter of training, not unlike what they learned in the process of growing up.


That process may well include painful moments of being "reproved" by parental correction or "scourged" by unwanted punishments. But a loving parent – like the "God who treats you as sons" – imposes discipline in the knowledge that trials and tribulations can serve as learning experiences. Even Jesus, "Son though He was – learned obedience from what He suffered" (Hebrews 5:8).

By discipline, a disciple learns to endure the trials of life as the way to enter into God's kingdom. Striving to endure tribulation takes effort. Effort issues from hope – a hope founded on the God whose kingdom it is.

In today's first reading, Isaiah prophesies about the antecedent activity of God on Israel's behalf. It is God who "comes to gather the nations." It is God who "sets a sign among them." It is God whose glory is proclaimed and to whom offerings are made on His "holy mountain."

Today's responsorial psalm, the shortest hymn of all, extols this God as worthy of praise from all people. Their praise and ours recognizes the divine attributes of steadfast kindness and fidelity on which the covenant and the kingdom are founded.

Knowing the faithful protection of God, as revealed in the redemption wrought by God's Son, is the Good News that gives us hope, inspires us to endure our trials, and enables us to strive to enter His kingdom.
