

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection

Readings: Sirach 3: 17-18, 20, 28-29. Psalm 68: 4-5, 6-7, 10-11. Hebrews 12: 18-19, 22-24a. Luke 14: 1, 7-14.

August's end marks a return to the ordinariness of home and school and work. Opening the Word today reveals a complementary virtue for living there with hope.

The first reading from Sirach offers paternal wisdom: "My child, conduct your affairs with humility." An inner disposition to lowliness, humility puts others first, demonstrating a relational concern more prized than the giving of material gifts. It avoids trying to master "what is too sublime" or to outmuscle "things beyond your strength." Humility keeps even the great and the wise "attentive" to learning from others.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus extends the disposition of humility to the domain of everyday life. With a two-part tale about dining, He situates hope in humble alternatives to social conventions.

Guests at a banquet typically want front row seats, the better to see and to be seen. Real esteem comes not from self-maneuvering ("reclining at table in the place of honor"), but from him who hosts the banquet and determines the final seating.

Likewise, dinner hosts may expect a repayment from guests, whether in gifts given or reciprocal invitations offered. True blessing comes not from self-serving generosity, but from a goodness that has eternity in mind ("the resurrection of the righteous").


Both examples teach that hope is not self-derived. It comes from another who holds a greater place - ultimately, the God who hosts an eternal banquet and even freely invites "the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind."

Today's second reading paints contrasting views of what inspires a response to God's invitation. The Israelites were impelled by terrifying signs (fire, darkness, storm, trumpet blast) to enter a covenant at Mount Sinai. But Christians are affected by the beauties of a "Heavenly Jerusalem," where angels gather, ancients (the "firstborn") are enrolled and "spirits of the just" (believers) are "made perfect."

We can approach that festive assembly now because of the "sprinkled blood" of Jesus on the Cross. By His "eloquent" mediation there, He speaks eternal redemption into effect and opens the way to "the city of the living God."

Christian hope, then, is not based on human ability or accomplishments. It comes from a humble appreciation of the Paschal Mystery, through which the Divine Goodness has "made a home" for those who humbly embrace their being poor in God's sight (Responsorial Psalm).

In his last public address, his *Urbi et Orbi* message on Easter Sunday, Pope Francis left us with an expression of paternal wisdom that connects humility and hope. 

NEW PARISHIONERS: WELCOME! Please register in the parish office or on our parish website.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Complete the Baptismal Registration Form online. Baptisms are held on the last weekend of the month (no Baptism during Lent and the month of December).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Contact the office at least one year before your wedding to schedule marriage preparation sessions. Marriage Requirements and Guidelines are intended to prepare you for the Sacrament of Marriage.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT THE HOSPITAL: Ask the patient's nurse to request a Catholic priest for Anointing of the Sick. The priest on-call will be contacted.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK IN CHURCH: St. Anthony Church holds Evening Prayer with Anointing of the Sick on the last Thursday of the odd number months.

HOLY COMMUNION & ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT HOME: Call the parish office to request an appointment.

FUNERALS: Notify our parish office FIRST—before confirming funeral arrangements with the mortuary. Family will meet with Parochial Vicar to plan Funeral Mass or prayer service.

MASS INTENTIONS: Mass Intentions are confirmed in the parish office one week before the requested date. Mass Intentions are read only at the 7:00 a.m. Mass / Monday through Saturday.

HOUSE BLESSINGS: Contact the parish office for an appointment.

BLESSING OF CARS & RELIGIOUS ARTICLES: Cars are blessed only after the Mass. To bless religious articles, approach the priest after any Mass for a blessing.
