

# Following a Dream

## This Week's Readings at Mass

- Isaiah 7:10-14 • Birth of Emmanuel
- Romans 1:1-7 • Greetings from Paul
- Matthew 1:18-24 • The birth of Jesus

We know very little about Jesus' earthly father, Joseph. From these few verses, we see a picture of a sensitive man of great integrity who was willing to change direction in trust when given guidance from God. Just as Mary was asked to take a tremendous leap of faith in saying yes to bearing Jesus, Joseph also was asked to trust in a situation that didn't make rational sense.

According to Jewish tradition, Mary and Joseph were legally married although they were still in their "engagement period." We can imagine his great inner turmoil upon discovering Mary was pregnant but not through him. It would have been a great shame to Joseph, personally and culturally. Legally, he was permitted to have her stoned to death, but he chose the more compassionate route, deciding to divorce her quietly rather than have her publicly humiliated and killed. That way, she would be able to return to the protection of her family to raise the child.

A dream changed everything. Without any guarantees that what he dreamed was real or trustworthy, Joseph woke up and followed the angel's instructions. Then three other times in Jesus' early life Joseph did what he was commanded in a dream, taking Jesus to Egypt to escape Herod and settling in the town of Nazareth to raise him. In doing so, he saved Jesus' life. It took both him and Mary working together and being open to unimagined directions to bring Jesus safely to adulthood.

# BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

## The Fourth Sunday of Advent - Gospel Reflection

Readings: *Isaiah 7:10-14. Psalm 24:1-2, 3-4, 5-6. Romans 1:1-7. Matthew 1:18-24*

The signs accompanying this time of year now invite closer attention. Opening the Word today, we hear familiar stories that raise our awareness of the calling that is Christmas.

In the first reading, Isaiah offers the Lord's aid to King Ahaz and invites him to seek an all-encompassing sign of it ("deep" or "high"). But Ahaz refuses. He has already asked neighboring Assyria for military help. The prophet calls out the king's feigned humility ("I will not tempt the Lord") and wearying leadership by announcing, instead, a divine sign: the conception and birth of a Son whose identity (His name) will reveal God's being is with His people ("Emmanuel").

The responsorial psalm beckons the same by calling for the Lord (the real "King of Glory") to enter into the world that is His.


Today's Gospel reading narrates how that glorious coming came about. In a revelatory dream, an angel makes Joseph aware of what the nosy villagers know: that his betrothed is with child. Already contracted for marriage, but not yet living with Joseph, Mary's surprising situation merits condemnation (Deuteronomy 22:20-21).

Joseph intends to stay true to his character: He chooses to avoid shaming Mary publicly. His righteousness is affirmed when he learns that the Child "has been conceived" by God (as the passive verb implies) for a providential reason (to "fulfill" the prophecies) and redemptive purpose (to "save" God's people).

To be born of this "young, unmarried woman" (later translated in the Septuagint as "virgin"), the Child will be a sign to all – the "Emmanuel" foretold by Isaiah centuries before. Now aware of what is really going on, Joseph demonstrates his righteousness by obeying the Lord, even at great social cost to himself.

That same faith-inspired awareness leads to the Christian calling. In today's second reading, Paul expresses this to the Romans by going beyond the standard greeting to extend "grace to you and peace." Those divinely infused gifts ("from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ") flow from the realization of salvation history – in the fulfillment of what God promised through His prophets, in what the Son of God taught as Gospel, and in the power of God made evident "through resurrection from the dead." These historic happenings underlie Paul's own allegiance (a "slave") to Christ Jesus, as well as his apostolic mission to make believers aware of their own calling "to belong to Jesus Christ" and to be "holy" as a community living in conformity with the gift they, too, have received.

That gracious gift is coming again at Christmas. The signs might point to a secular holiday, but the advent of Christ's Nativity calls us to the holy awareness of how God is with us still.
