

A Holy, Human Family



This Week's Readings at Mass

- Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 • Duties toward parents
- Colossians 3:12-21 • The practice of virtues
- Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23 • The flight to Egypt

With the story of Jesus' birth still fresh in our minds on this first Sunday after Christmas, the church uses the opportunity to celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family with all of the readings focused on families. The Gospel readings are from Matthew this year, so the focus this week is on Jesus' earthly father, Joseph. (When we read from the Gospel of Luke, the focus is on his mother, Mary.)

If the story of Jesus' birth warmed our hearts with its tale of the star over Bethlehem and the magi who traveled long distances to worship and bring him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, the story today takes a terrible turn. Mary and Joseph have no time to savor his birth or let the wonder of the magi's visit sink in because suddenly their baby's life is in danger. Like millions of refugees throughout history, they must flee their home country on short notice with just a vague sense of a distant destination. Because they trust the guidance the angel gave Joseph in a dream, they save their son's life.

Tragically, however, many families lost sons to Herod's cruelty when he ordered all baby boys killed in his efforts to kill Jesus. (These verses are omitted from the Gospel passage today.) So the Feast of the Holy Family is not "The Feast of the Perfect Family in a Perfect World." The Church celebrates this family today because of Mary and Joseph's willingness to say "yes" to raising God's son, even though it brought them great fear, anxiety, uncertainty, and even anguish because of the evil one man, Herod, wreaked on so many families. They were a

holy family, but they did not escape any challenges of being a human family.

Questions of the Week

- ① Does it change anything for you to think about Jesus' family in terms of being a refugee family like so many millions today and throughout history? How so?
- ② Mary and Joseph changed course unexpectedly when they needed to in order to protect Jesus' life. When have you had to change direction suddenly? Can you see the hand of God at work in that change?

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph - Gospel Reflection

Readings: Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14. Psalm 128:1-2, 3, 4-5. Colossians 3:12-21. Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23.

In the octave celebration of Christmas, opening the Word on this feast reveals the primal place where the Nativity leans into human life.

In the first reading, Sirach extols paternal solicitude, not merely as a kindness or a custom, but for its religious benefits. Honoring one's father through obedience and loyalty can atone for sins, lead prayers to be heard and engender a long life – because respectful submission to a father reflects a filial fidelity befitting the people's relationship to the God who created and redeemed them as a nation.

Those aware of this wisdom, "who fear the Lord and walk in His ways," are blessed indeed. For they will experience the favor of the Lord (responsorial psalm).

In today's Gospel reading, Joseph learns of it along with "the Child and His Mother" (the family unit that is referenced four times) by submitting to the Divine Will revealed to him in more dreams.


The first dream guides the family to Egypt to escape Herod's murderous intentions. A second angelic message later sends them to Israel where one of Herod's sons, Archelaus, ruthlessly rules the inherited portion of his father's kingdom that included Judea. Fearing for his family's safety, Joseph follows the inspiration of a third dream and moves them to Galilee to settle in Nazareth (where, some say, the small number of inhabitants were relatives of Joseph's extended family).

But today's Gospel serves as more than a travel log with a supernatural positioning system. It narrates an experience of providential planning and prophetic fulfillment. In the locale of love that is the Holy Family, God the Father provides for His Son by leading Joseph on his way. Joseph provides for the Child and His mother by obediently following God's revealed directions.

From this, the Christ Child receives two passports to His identity as Savior. He is called "out of Egypt," just as God's "son" Israel was at the time of the Exodus (Hosea 11:1). And He is perpetually known as a "Nazorean," as attested by the sign Pilate affixes to the cross (John 19:19).

In today's second reading, Paul extends the call for family fidelity to the "chosen ones" of the Christian community. There, too, believers are bound to one another in love, a "bond of perfection" because of Him who is its source, Him by whom they are made "holy and beloved." Virtues flow from this relationship. Peace controls it. Wisdom dwells in it. Gratitude accompanies it.

The eternal power of love that came to being in the Nativity of Jesus and was embodied in the obedient fidelity of Joseph and Mary can dwell in our midst when we live and act in accord with these feasts we celebrate.
