

It Seemed Irrational

This Week's Readings at Mass

- Isaiah 60:1-6 • Glory of the new Zion
- Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6 • Commission to preach God's plan
- Matthew 2:1-12 • The visit of the magi

The story of the magi following the star to Bethlehem to find the baby Jesus is one of the most heartwarming parts of the Christmas story. The Greek word for the foreign visitors is best translated "magi" although in popular understanding they are sometimes called the "Three Kings" or the "Three Wise Men." Whoever they were, they are an example to us of great courage and trust. They willingly left their home countries to travel for an unknown distance in search of a newborn child they knew nothing about. They packed expensive gifts (a dangerous/courageous act when traveling overland in those days) and met with the most powerful man in the country, King Herod, on their quest to find the baby.

When they found the baby in an unassuming little town in an ordinary family, their hearts told them they were in the right place and they were overjoyed. The humble surroundings didn't stop them from worshiping the little child and then offering their lavish gifts to him. After that, they dared to listen to their dreams and defy the King, thereby protecting the vulnerable child. Probably none of what they did seemed rational to those around them, but because they followed an inner guidance, we still celebrate their journey today.

The Epiphany of the Lord

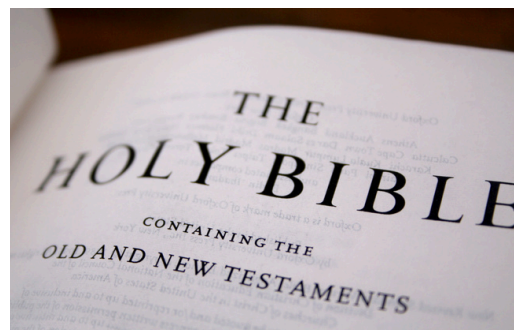
What's not to like about the solemnity of the Epiphany? The Church celebrates the global evangelization of the Gospel of Christ, which desires to incorporate "all nations" into the Good News. God draws all people into the divine embrace. Just look at the geographic migration that Isaiah paints in the first reading, certainly emblematic of the three kings of different origin who are on a journey together to see the newborn Lord. In the words of today's responsorial psalm, "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you."

The gathering of the peoples of different nations and languages foreshadows the mystery of the kingdom of God, in which praise is the unifying crescendo in worship for the one true King. All other claims to power and kingly, merciless autocracy are fraudulent, bogus and dangerous. King Herod represents exhibit A when it comes to divesting the region he governs of its new threat to his power. And he is not the only one. The populous also cooperates with his evil when the Gospel says that King Herod "was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him."

No wonder! The earthly pretense of Jerusalem will not be able to withstand this new Infant King, who is about to usher into its midst the reign of God and the New Jerusalem. This new king will disclose that this secular empire is about to collapse under the weight of grace and the multiplication of all of God's children since "the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel." God's table breaks under the weight of love.

Our own faith journey takes us on the road to Bethlehem, guided by the great star. Ironically, the butcher King Herod gives us the mandate himself: "Go and search diligently for the child." We do so in the community the Word: of the fragile human family, where Christ Himself has chosen to dwell as true God and true man.

As we gather for worship, we might remember that the rich history of the Mystical Body of Christ obliges us to recognize our stewardship of God's grace to one another, especially as we come to worship at the Eucharist. How can Christ be divided in praise as he speaks back a Word to the Father? Remember, we have not a lasting city, nor a gated community. But Christ, the Door, has opened Himself as the way, and none shall shut its portal to those gathering on God's holy mountain.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Complete the Baptismal Registration Form online or contact Diane Jacinto at the Church Office - 808-244-4148. Baptisms are held on the last weekend of the month (no Baptisms during Lent and the month of December).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Contact the office at least one year before your wedding to schedule marriage preparation sessions.

ANointing OF THE SICK AT THE HOSPITAL: Ask the patient's nurse to contact the Hospital Chaplain who will call a Catholic priest. He will respond.

ANointing OF THE SICK OUTSIDE OF THE HOSPITAL / HOSPICE: Call the parish office at 808-244-4148. Listen to the prompts carefully after office hours.

HOLY COMMUNION FOR THE SICK & HOMEBOUND: Call the parish office. We will make arrangements to have the Body of Christ brought to your family member.
