BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed -**Gospel Reflection**


Readings: Wisdom 3:1-9. Psalm 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6. Romans 5:5-11. John 6:37-40.

I have usually found seminarians to be very responsive to a close reading of Dante's "Purgatorio," the second volume of the "Divine Comedy." Despite the gulf of many centuries, there are abundant commonalities between the 21st century reader and the medieval vision of those who climb the steps to a blessed, sanctified state.

The path up the seven-story mountain, as the pilgrims are purified from one dangerous state of sin to a lesser form of veniality, is quite steep. Unlike "Inferno," which encompasses its own levels of punishment for eternity and from which nobody escapes or becomes sanctified, or "Paradiso," whose saints embody an interplanetary, eternal state of blessedness difficult for us to imagine, the state of ongoing purgation has a plot driven by an essential virtue: hope. The lesson we can draw from commemorating All Souls' Day is that God's mercy is constitutive of His very identity. We have reason to embody this Year of Hope, a jubilee celebrating a climb that urges us toward a vision of the Trinity.

Hope as a state of purgation demands a faith filled soul, as today's first reading tells us when it says of those who have departed this life, "chastised a little, they shall be greatly blessed, because God tried them and found them worthy of Himself." Christian discipleship is also disciplineship, which knows that our trials bear the fruit not of bitterness, but of hope. That becoming a hopeful community, we are transformed. We are "greatly blessed" and worthy of a vision of the love of God. Not accidentally, the responsorial psalm sings joyfully of the Lord as shepherd who accompanies us on a journey toward "restful waters" where "He refreshes my soul." Echoing the covenant to abide with us forever, Jesus tells His disciples in today's Gospel that He will not lose anything that the Father has given Him. That means us, living and deceased.

An important theological point that should never escape us or those to whom we minister, underlined by Paul's admonition to the Romans, is that we do not justify ourselves or sanctify ourselves. We cooperate with God's saving plan toward reconciliation by striving up the mountain through the virtues of faith, hope, and love. The invitation to the people of God today may well be to allow God to bring His beloved dead to Himself through the aid of our prayers. The final testimony of a hopeful journey through life is an invigorated prayer life with and for others, full of joy and not despair, reconciled in a love full of trust that the risen Christ is with us.
