

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Thirty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection


Readings: Malachi 3:19-20a. Psalm 98:5-6, 7-8, 9. 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12. Luke 21:5-19.

We do not like being caught unaware or unprepared, do we? The liturgical year has set a mousetrap in November. The preceding Sundays have not given us the biblical and liturgical signals that typically tell us that the "end" is near. Today's readings for this penultimate Sunday in Ordinary Time, sandwiched as it is between two great feasts - the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica and the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King - burst forth with an apocalyptic imagination of a prophet on fire with God's justice.

The first reading begins, "Lo, the day is coming, blazing like an oven, when all the proud and all evildoers will be stubble." Malachi's use of the simile "blazing like an oven" suggests that something has been baking and is ready to be brought to the table. The heat will be so intense that these evildoers will be reduced to "stubble," leaving them "neither root nor branch." Who or what is the cause of this sacred inferno? "The sun of justice with its healing rays." It would not be the first time, either in Hollywood disaster movies or the biblical imagination, that catastrophic fire has been deployed to forecast the ruin of some and the salvation of a few. In an unusual reversal, however, Malachi says that salvation will come from the fire itself, the sun of justice. He will not carry destruction, but "healing rays."

Similarly, Jesus asks His listeners to be prepared and to live in the space of holy perseverance. Leave the future manifestation of God to the divine will and look here and now for the disclosure of holy icons of the kingdom. Paul asks the Thessalonians to imitate him in simply carrying on works of charity and justice. Stop minding the business of others, do not expect to be served by others, but instead work toward equality. This advice dates from antiquity: Model yourself on the society of the virtuous and you will find virtue. If you want to be just, imitate the behavior of the righteous. Get off TikTok and volunteer at a soup kitchen.

Jesus tells us not to be distracted by thrills, excitements and imposters of a messiah. Indeed, the messianic moment is already in our midst by Christ's presence through the wisdom He has given us to continue to witness to the Word. Can we live in the "almost but not yet" moment typical of the Lucan narrative? Waiting for the Lord until the end while we carry on with works of justice and mercy is harder than imagining a spectacle. These acts of charity should be so visible that they themselves witness to the coming of the Lord. We will not get there without perseverance and grace and listening to the wisdom of Jesus speaking to us in Word and Sacrament.
