You inspired St. Francis to call all of them his brothers and sisters.



### **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

### 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection

Readings: 2 Kings 5:14-17. Psalm 98:1, 2-3, 3-4. 2 Timothy 2:8-13. Luke 17:11-19.

How easily do we settle in life! When what we have seems sufficiently good and what we do works well enough, we become content. Opening the Word today invites us to go further and, in faith, to be grateful for the greater good beyond mere satisfaction.

Today's first reading tells the story of Naaman, an Aramean army commander sent by his king to Israel in search of supernatural healing. Naaman's leprosy leaves him only after he acquiesces to Elisha's instruction and undertakes a ritual cleansing (plunging seven times) in the supposedly inferior waters of the Jordan River.

The heathen experiences not only bodily healing, but spiritual insight. Grateful for being cured, Naaman offers Elisha a gift. The prophet refuses, thereby signaling that Naaman's cure originates with the Lord's beneficence, not the prophet's word nor the river's magic. Naaman gets it. He decides to express his gratitude in sacrificial worship.

With Naaman's story as prima facie evidence, the responsorial psalm acclaims what faith understands: "The Lord has revealed to the nations His saving power." That power issues from divine "kindness," reflects the Lord's "faithfulness" toward Israel, and remains evident to "all the ends of the Earth."


Today's Gospel narrates that gracious power in Jesus' encounter with ten lepers. Estranged from others on account of their physical condition, they come to "meet" Him (a Lucan term with overtones of the Second Coming), but they keep their distance, as required by law.

Loudly acknowledging Jesus' power ("Master"), they plead for "pity," not just sympathy for their misfortune, but an active regard for them based on a shared relationship. They want Jesus to alleviate their physical and social burden. Believing He will, they follow His directive and are cleansed as they go.

One of them gets what really happened. His life, not just his health, has been restored. So he returns – physically – to the place of encounter with Jesus, and also spiritually, to the One who brought him healing. Glorifying God, he adopts a posture typical of homage (falling at Jesus' feet) and offers thanks. In the example of this Samaritan, an infidel to Israelites, Jesus teaches His disciples to recognize the saving power of faith.

For the Christian community, that faith is founded on the "gospel" of Jesus having been "raised from the dead," as Paul exclaims in today's second reading. The apostle proclaims to Timothy a "trustworthy" principle of faith: "If we have died with Him, we shall also live with Him. If we persevere" – last week's lesson – "we shall also reign with Him."

Kindness beyond kinship, salvation beyond health, life beyond death – the bounteous grace of God offers so much more than what suffices. Faith gets that and disposes us to be grateful.
