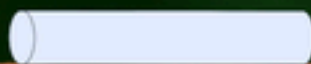

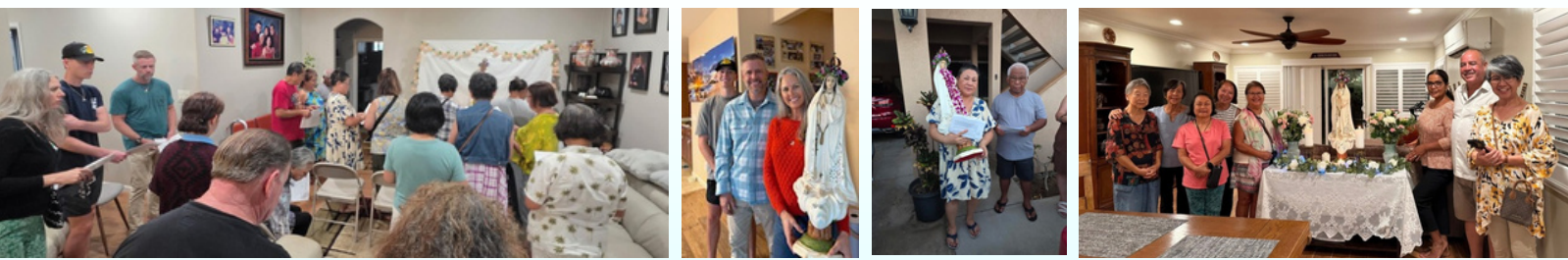

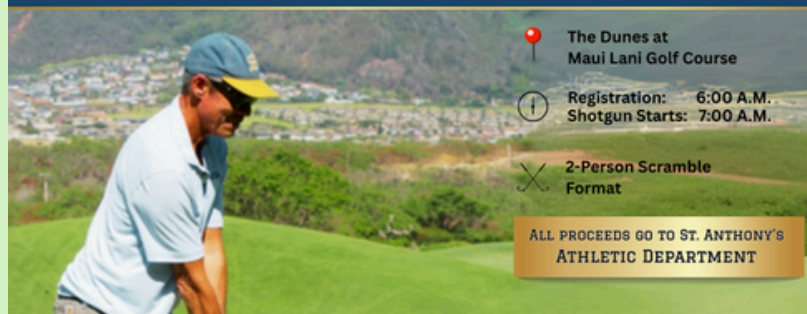

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection

Readings: Exodus 17:8-13. Psalm 121:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8. 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2. Luke 18:1-8

No one completes life's journey with ease. Opening the Word today reveals how faith emboldens believers to take on challenges with courage and to overcome obstacles with conviction.

The history of Israel is rife with stories of imminent danger. In today's first reading, the Amalekites pose the threat. Nomadic inhabitants of the Egyptian peninsula, they ambush the Israelites along their route toward Sinai. Defeat would spell a bitter end to the Exodus and the hope of reaching the Promised Land.

Moses knew better. He commands Joshua to enter the fray, despite the odds against them. Moses climbs a hill in the direction of the God in whom they believe. He raises his arms aloft in intercession and keeps them up with the help of Aaron and Hur. The leaders' determined faith that the Lord would intervene yields the hoped-for result, as Joshua and company "mowed down Amalek and his people." The Israelites' journey can continue.

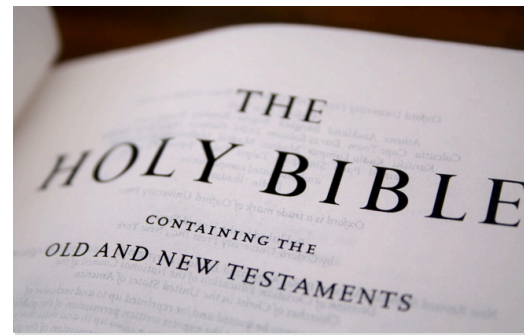
The battle narrative comes to lyric expression in today's responsorial psalm. It acclaims "the Lord who made Heaven and Earth" as the source of abiding help. With faith, the chosen people can count on divine assistance because the Lord is active ("neither slumbers nor sleeps"), present ("beside you"), and protective (like shade). "Both now and forever," the Lord remains "the guardian of Israel."

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus personalizes that power of faith through the story of a lone widow facing a dishonest judge. The former finds herself accused by some "adversary." With little social standing to elicit support, she turns to the court as her only recourse. Presumably her religious heritage gives her the courage to believe she will prevail and the conviction to insist that a just decision be rendered for her.

The judge, however, has little interest in her problem. Neither fearing God (the guarantor of justice), nor respecting other humans (being affected by their plight), he appears concerned only with himself. Still, the widow's relentless pleas "bother" him; he worries his honor will be offended should she choose to "come and strike" him, a plausible scenario since she has nothing else to lose. So he decides in her favor. Justice benefits when faith insists.

Jesus intends the parable as a lesson in not "growing weary" about prayer or losing confidence in God's willingness to come to human assistance. In today's second reading, Paul exhorts the same faith of Timothy and charges him to "be persistent" in proclaiming the inspired Word. Hence, proclaiming the Gospel remains the Clergy's primary duty.

For the Christian community, courageous faith is revealed, proclaimed and sustained through Sacred Scripture. Believing that God intervenes on behalf of His people – as He has done definitively in the person of Jesus – provides the conviction necessary to face any challenge in this world.
