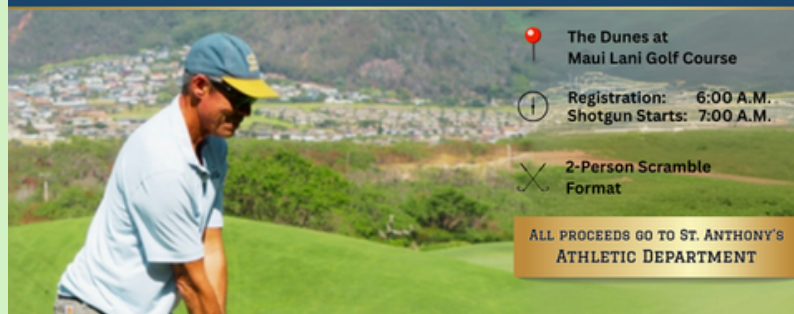

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection

*Readings: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18. Psalm 34:2-3, 17-18, 19, 23.
2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18. Luke 18:9-14.*

On life's journey, many seek to forge their own paths to success. Opening the Word today points instead to humble dependence as the proper disposition for people of faith.

Today's first reading from Sirach pictures God as especially attentive to the lowly in society: the weak and the oppressed, the orphan and the widow. Having accrued no worldly dignity, they enjoy preeminent standing before God. As ones who "serve God willingly," without regard for social benefits, their prayer "pierces the clouds" to reach Him who always "judges justly and affirms the right."

As the responsorial psalm exclaims, "The Lord hears the cry of the poor." Having no social reputation on which to stand, they are prone to becoming "brokenhearted" by their lot in life and "crushed in spirit" by this world's lack of justice. Yet their faithful dependence on the Lord gives them more: a supernatural hearing that cannot otherwise be earned, and a divine refuge that safeguards them from incurring guilt until their eventual reward.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus affirms the faith of the poor with a parable contrasting two characters at prayer.

One, a Pharisee, "took up his position" in the temple area, presumably his usual, prominent spot. The other, a tax collector, "stood off at a distance," perhaps to hide from his unwelcome reputation as a publican.

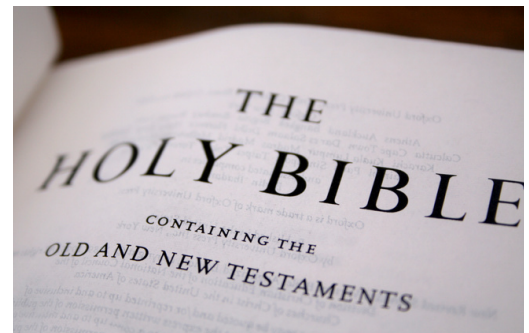
The Pharisee's prayer is self-absorbed. He begins by appearing to thank God. But his soliloquy lauds his own independent achievements (fasting more often than necessary and tithing a greater amount than required), while deriding the sinfulness of "the rest of humanity."

The tax collector's few words are self-effacing. He expresses no thanks. He professes no self-value. Instead, he identifies himself "a sinner" and humbly pleads that God "be merciful" to him.

The contrast could not be starker. The Pharisee remains rich with self-righteousness, while the poor publican relies completely on the grace of God. The story ends with Jesus pronouncing definitively which disposition leads to exaltation.

In today's second reading, Paul writes of "being poured out like a libation," thereby likening his apostolic life to a votive offering. Deserted by others in his time of need, he came to depend entirely on the Lord who "stood by him and gave him strength." That faith he proclaimed steadily to the Gentiles. As his life nears completion, Paul shares with Timothy how his "poor" faith gives him more: the confidence of being brought "safe to the Lord's heavenly kingdom."

The good news for our journey is found in the faith that accompanies us. When we cultivate the dispositions proper to it, we can be confident that the Lord will hear the cry of our prayer and give us strength to continue on the way to salvation.
