BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection

*Readings: Wisdom 9: 13-18b. Psalm 90: 3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14 & 17.
Philemon 9-10, 12-17. Luke 14: 25-33.*

The summer has faded, together with vacations, beach parties, and outdoor BBQs. The kids are returning to school. So now what? That may have been a question parents asked decades ago, when the demands of youth sports and other extracurricular activities did not claim so much of their time during the school year. Billy has football practice; Jill has gymnastics. And the high school band is meeting to get ready for constant rehearsals. It is always a mad dash, isn't it? Forget about time for reflection – unless it is waiting for kids in the carpool line. Maybe.

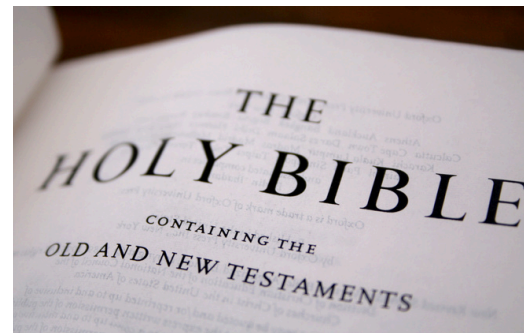
Jesus addressed the crowds in today's Gospel, and that means people like you and me. People with busy lives who are not just sitting around, but are on the move. As Luke says, "Great crowds were traveling with Jesus."

The first question we need to ask is whether we really want to journey with Jesus or not. That means making our Christian commitment a priority, especially when it comes to a relationship with Him.

There is always the possibility of getting lost in the crowd – sometimes intentionally. We might go on autopilot when it comes to our relationship with God and our parish community, and just keep repeating the same practices and habits. That usually means we follow our old path and not the new one that Jesus is traveling. Sadly, our path has become the road most traveled. This applies to busy pastors as well. There is something like a machine that gets going with the school year and, before we know it, the years have slipped by. And with that precious time, our journey of faith has become a nondescript superhighway.

Jesus makes it clear that He does not want us to be just one of the crowd. He wants a personal covenant with us. "Hate your own life, your attachments, even your family?" This is a shocking statement and so it is meant to be. This challenge is not meant to be taken literally, but to jar us into a new pathway of thinking. How much do I love Christ and His cross? There is the test of discipleship, which calls us to really follow when the rubber hits the road. It is going to be the calculations that test us, even as the Lord follows His challenge with an illustration of how to carry out a particular plan. I have met many people over the years who feel bad about how their life is going, who want to be better disciples, but who do not have a plan or a firm amendment to take them to the end of their goal – love.

I suggest that this plan is the real edge for today's Gospel. Let's call it a "road map for my discipleship." What would it look like just for you?

GENERAL CHURCH INFORMATION

NEW PARISHIONERS: WELCOME!
Please register in the parish office or on our parish website.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Complete the Baptismal Registration Form online. Baptisms are held on the last weekend of the month (no Baptism during Lent and the month of December).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Contact the office at least one year before your wedding to schedule marriage preparation sessions. Marriage Requirements and Guidelines are intended to prepare you for the Sacrament of Marriage.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT THE HOSPITAL: Ask the patient's nurse to request a Catholic priest for Anointing of the Sick. The priest on-call will be contacted.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK IN CHURCH: St. Anthony Church holds Evening Prayer with Anointing of the Sick on the last Thursday of the odd number months.

HOLY COMMUNION & ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT HOME: Call the parish office to request an appointment.

FUNERALS: Notify our parish office FIRST—before confirming funeral arrangements with the mortuary. Family will meet with Parochial Vicar to plan Funeral Mass or prayer service.

MASS INTENTIONS: Mass Intentions are confirmed in the parish office one week before the requested date. Mass Intentions are read only at the 7:00 a.m. Mass / Monday through Saturday.

HOUSE BLESSINGS: Contact the parish office for an appointment.

BLESSING OF CARS & RELIGIOUS ARTICLES: Cars are blessed only after the Mass. To bless religious articles, approach the priest after any Mass for a blessing.
