



We'd like to take a moment to share important updates and blessings here at St. Anthony School this week.

Campus Safety Enhancements

In light of a recent incident involving an unfamiliar individual entering a student restroom on the grade school campus, we have taken immediate and proactive steps to increase safety for our entire school community.

Thanks to the support of our administration and staff, we have installed security cameras in these key areas: the grade school campus, the back of the upper campus (near the weight room), and the back of the preschool. These additional layers of security are part of a comprehensive effort to ensure our keiki are protected at all times. In addition to these upgrades, the buddy system for restroom use is being strictly enforced. Entire class bathroom breaks are encouraged, especially for our younger students. Staff are reminded to remain vigilant, to conduct periodic restroom checks, and to report any unfamiliar individuals on campus to Maui Police Department immediately. We are committed to maintaining a safe and nurturing environment, grounded in our Catholic values. Mahalo for your continued prayers and partnership in this effort.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross - Gospel Reflection


Readings: Numbers 21:4b-9. Psalm 78:1bc-2, 34-35, 36-37, 38. Philippians 2:6-11. John 3:13-17.

Today we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This commemoration allows for a more participative access of the Eucharistic assembly, gathered for worship on the Lord's Day. Just as the first day of the week is the centerpiece of our daily life, so too is the cross of Christ the focus of our commitment to discipleship. We see the crucified Lord in every Catholic house of worship as the People of God gather because the cross acknowledges that Christ emptied Himself completely in a death like ours, but was raised up. The cross is a sign of that victory. We do not go anywhere without Christ's cross. History did not either.

Notre Dame professor Robin Jensen's wonderful book, "The Cross: History, Art and Controversy," covers the diverse and fascinating history of the cross in cultural and religious tradition. Jensen says that the cross is just everywhere in Christian art; it is almost impossible to imagine that this matchless symbol was not there from the early days of the emergent Church. The cross, then, is a reflection of our own times, as theologians and Scripture scholars puzzle out how we have interpreted God's ultimate act of redemption and self-gift.

A crucified Messiah became for Paul the scandalum crucis, a deliberate transgression of our expectations. In today's first reading, the cross can be seen in the serpent mounted on a pole, providing healing and life. Paradoxically, early Christians celebrated the cross as a sign of victory over sin and death, not as an instrument of Roman torture. Jensen takes us well into our own age with the Ku Klux Klan's disturbing use of the burning cross as a racist intimidation tactic. Given the complicated Christology and Christian symbols involved, the cross has become as divergent as it is glorious.

I suggest that, as we stand before the cross today, we meditate on the ancient hymn in Philippians chronicled in today's second reading, one of the most ancient texts attributed to the Pauline corpus. It reminds us that the cross is the ultimate act of humility, as the incarnate Lord freely chose to share in our death through obedience to the Father's will. In emptying Himself, Jesus gives us a reality check on how we are to literally spend ourselves in service to one another according to our vocation in life. In our baptism, we live out Christ's own death for the sake of God, the Church, and the human family. As we embrace what God has given each of us, we lift our cross with Christ, with whom we share our redemptive life.





GENERAL CHURCH INFORMATION

NEW PARISHIONERS: WELCOME!
Please register in the parish office or on our parish website.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Complete the Baptismal Registration Form online. Baptisms are held on the last weekend of the month (no Baptism during Lent and the month of December).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Contact the office at least one year before your wedding to schedule marriage preparation sessions. Marriage Requirements and Guidelines are intended to prepare you for the Sacrament of Marriage.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT THE HOSPITAL: Ask the patient's nurse to request a Catholic priest for Anointing of the Sick. The priest on-call will be contacted.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK IN CHURCH: St. Anthony Church holds Evening Prayer with Anointing of the Sick on the last Thursday of the odd number months.

HOLY COMMUNION & ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT HOME: Call the parish office to request an appointment.

FUNERALS: Notify our parish office FIRST—before confirming funeral arrangements with the mortuary. Family will meet with Parochial Vicar to plan Funeral Mass or prayer service.

MASS INTENTIONS: Mass Intentions are confirmed in the parish office one week before the requested date. Mass Intentions are read only at the 7:00 a.m. Mass / Monday through Saturday.

HOUSE BLESSINGS: Contact the parish office for an appointment.

BLESSING OF CARS & RELIGIOUS ARTICLES: Cars are blessed only after the Mass. To bless religious articles, approach the priest after any Mass for a blessing.
