



#### **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

#### 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection

Readings: Amos 8:4-7. Psalm 113:1-2, 4-6, 7-8. 1 Timothy 2:1-8. Luke 16:1-13.


Today's Gospel presents us with one of Jesus' more difficult parables to interpret. We are seemingly not helped too much by the adjacent conversation partners in the Sunday Lectionary. There is a rather furious outpouring of anger from the prophet Amos about God's vengeance on cheats. In the second reading, St. Paul asks for prayers "that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity." We might ask, then, how do we strive for God's justice as well as for peace? And where does the dishonest steward fit in? Jesus calls him dishonest, but he also settles accounts in peace.

It helps to read the parable of the unjust steward with an eye toward how this passage fits into other Lucan material. We know that Luke's concern tends toward the practical, everyday living of the Christian life. This includes the use of money. The Book of Acts shows the early Church figuring out what to do with shared community wealth and its consequences, as we see in the account of Ananias and Sapphira, who hoarded their shekels in secret and came to an unhappy end (Acts 5:1-11).

The parable of the unjust steward begins with "a rich man," as does the parable that follows about the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31), two teachings with stories about how to deal with wealth. The difference between them is that Jesus intensifies His second story for a different audience. The parable of the dishonest steward is directed at His disciples, but the implied hearers of the parable about the rich man who ignores Lazarus at his gate are the Pharisees, described as lovers of money (Luke 16:14).

I think the dishonest steward, as Jesus suggests, is a child of this world and makes the most of what he has been dealt, similar to Jesus' disciples with their various inclinations and backgrounds. This steward serves as an example for people who must cope with the world's wealth as if they were "shrewd as serpents" (Matthew 10:16). Jesus is not preaching to naive country bumpkins. Instead, prudence becomes the operative virtue; it is a scale that weighs the world in balance. Obviously, Jesus is not praising dishonesty, but commending a quality like prudence, which can help discern proper judgment in an imperfect world. The steward is not consumed by wealth.

Lovers of money seem altogether a different matter because of their higher dishonesty – hypocrisy. At least the dishonest (let's call him *shrewd*) steward has a future when it comes to learning how to deal with true riches. The hint here is that our steward is able to detach himself from wealth as if it were a game of some sort. That is not true for the religious elite in Jesus' day. For them, Jesus reserves the next parable.





**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY:** Contact the office at least one year before your wedding to schedule marriage preparation sessions. Marriage Requirements and Guidelines are intended to prepare you for the Sacrament of Marriage.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT THE HOSPITAL:** Ask the patient's nurse to request a Catholic priest for Anointing of the Sick. The priest on-call will be contacted.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK IN CHURCH:** St. Anthony Church holds Evening Prayer with Anointing of the Sick on the last Thursday of the odd number months.

**HOLY COMMUNION & ANOINTING OF THE SICK AT HOME:** Call the parish office to request an appointment.

**FUNERALS:** Notify our parish office FIRST—before confirming funeral arrangements with the mortuary. Family will meet with Parochial Vicar to plan Funeral Mass or prayer service.

MASS INTENTIONS: Mass Intentions are confirmed in the parish office one week before the requested date. Mass Intentions are read only at the 7:00 a.m. Mass / Monday through Saturday.

**HOUSE BLESSINGS:** Contact the parish office for an appointment.

**BLESSING OF CARS & RELIGIOUS ARTICLES:** Cars are blessed only after the Mass. To bless religious articles, approach the priest after any Mass for a blessing.
