Annual Report to Parishioners:

Summary of the Statement of Activities for the fiscal year 07/01/2024 to 06/30/2025

This year's report represents the fourth year under the guidance of Rev. Msgr. Terrence Watanabe. We have included for your review financial information for all three entities: St. Anthony Church, St. Anthony Preschool and St. Anthony School. We have been chosen to participate this year in the Diocese of Honolulu Procedural Audit for the parish.

We are pleased to acknowledge members of the Finance Council: Hilton Unemori, Chairperson, Alesia Macugay, Secretary, Paul Horikawa, Hank Pacheco, Valerie Standing, Tammy Fukagawa, Michael Simonds, Richard Cirimelli, and Michael Victorino. We thank you for your support and guidance.

This year, our offertory collections were up 9% over last year. The combined **total income**, which includes Restricted Donations, Custodial Collections, and Other Donations, put the parish at **\$1,147,386** or 15% over last year.

Total expenses increased this year by \$53,777, or approximately 5% compared to the previous year, for a total of **\$1,118,140**. The categories of Professional Services and Leadership Development saw the largest increases for the year.

The Total Change in Assets was \$29,245.

Statement of Financial Position at 06/30/2025

The amount shown in the Checking Account of \$448,258 includes \$330,414.20 for Restricted Income, leaving \$117,844.18 for normal operating expenses. The Maui Disaster Relief Fund has a balance of \$286,804.47 in Restricted Income. The Parish Revolving Fund/Savings has a balance of \$23,979.75 and the Building Fund has a balance of \$62,658.77. Combined with receivables and fixed assts, our **total assets** are **\$28,550,155**.

The **total liabilities** are at **\$680,504**, which includes Custodial Funds (Restricted Funds, including the Maui Disaster Relief Fund). Also included are the three loans, totaling \$304,767.

For the fourth year in a row, we have been very successful with Debt Reduction collection, which started in February 2022. The loan balance at the end of January 2022 was \$147,053.63 and the minimum loan interest payment was \$622.02. At the end of fiscal year June 2025, the ending loan balance was \$56,178 and the minimum loan interest payment was \$280.02. The parish has been able to lower the debt by \$90,876 and reduce the required minimum monthly interest payment by \$342.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Gospel Reflection

Readings: Amos 6:1a, 4-7. Psalm 146:7, 8-9, 9-10. 1 Timothy 6:11-16. Luke 16:19-31.

When Our Lord speaks of wealth, we are on tricky terrain. The Christian community comprises many folks who have worked very hard to make a just living for their families and contribute to the community, including their parishes. When it comes to the parable of the rich man and Lazarus, it is important to note the very important and explicit details Luke gives us as interpretive clues to this passage.


The first of these clues concerns the listeners. Some are religious elites who love money (Luke 16:14). That means we ought not simply jump to the conclusion that Jesus despises rich people. No, the question is this: Do we possess wealth or do our riches possess us and blind us to the needs of others? This observation is especially appropriate, considering Luke's stance on discipleship and how worldly attachments can obscure our vision. Detachment means not being struck blind by our successes, but remaining open to grace and living in daily gratitude.

The second clue is the proximity of the two protagonists and how they behave. Luke goes into fine detail when it comes to the rich man's living style, particularly his "purple garments and fine linen" (a slam at religious garb, perhaps) and the way he dines "sumptuously each day." The author wants us to see that something is out of balance between this overstuffed and overdressed lout and poor Lazarus, who is lying at the rich man's door, licked by dogs. Consumed by self-absorption, the rich man does not see him. Lazarus might as well be invisible. The parable is directing us to see the blindness that often comes with narcissistic acquisition and self-indulgent living. That includes consuming religious praise (hypocrisy).

The third clue of the parable is how the characters are judged because of their actions. The scene in the afterlife is reversed, with Lazarus resting in Abraham's bosom and the rich man in torments. Lazarus has been noticed by the story's narrator, since he is given a name, but he utters not a word throughout the parable.

On the other hand, the rich man uses rhetoric even in the netherworld, as if arguing a law case. He directs Abraham to have pity on him. He tries to get his brothers off the hook of a like destiny. We could call the rich man's behavior typical of those who not only love money, but also love the power that goes with wealth, even doling out commands and trying to exert control and power in the afterlife. It would be funny if the scene were not so sad.

It is hard to believe that anyone who reads this parable could possibly subscribe to the so-called "prosperity gospel." Just ask the rich man. Or better yet, ask Lazarus by name.


