2025 All Boys Camp Policies and Procedures

Mission Statement:

The purpose of All Boys Camp is to provide each participant the opportunity to experience fun, fellowship, and spiritual fulfillment in a secure relationship with Jesus Christ.

Participation:

- 1. Boys and young men in grades 3 12 and under the age of 18 are eligible to attend all three days. Boys in grades K-2 are welcome to attend the Saturday Only event. If accompanied by a father or grandfather, they can stay for the full weekend. All minors are required to attend as a member of a group or outpost.
- 2. Groups can be from any Assembly of God church or Church of God church, a church with a chartered outpost, or other approved churches.
- 3. All adults (18 and older) attending All Boys Camp are **required** to have a current year adult verification form on file with the Georgia District of the Assemblies of God. This policy is strictly enforced for the protection of children. All AVFs must be received by the registration deadline (September 15).

Visitors:

- 1. Visitors may visit on Saturday after 9:00 am. We ask that female visitors not be in the camping area except between 9:30am and 8:00pm.
- 2. All visitors must submit an adult verification by the registration deadline (September 15) for approval. Anyone not following this protocol will not be allowed on property.

Registration:

- 1. CHECK IN
 - Friday, September 26 5:30pm-7:00pm (CAFETERIA)
 - Saturday, September 27 8:00am-9:00am (CAFETERIA)
- 2. The main leader will be dropped off at the cafeteria to check in and receive housing assignment. Please bring with you the following items:
 - Balance (check or credit card)
 - All campers medications with accompanying paperwork
- 3. Boys and all other leaders must go to the gym and wait there until the main leader rejoins them. Activities are available while you wait.
- 4. **NOTE:** Gates will not open until 4:00 pm.
- 5. All vehicles must be out of all areas and parked in the upper or lower parking lots by 8:00 pm Friday night. (no exceptions)
- 6. Each outpost must register and sign in all **visitors**.

Dorms:

- 1. All Leaders must sleep in the small leader's room (preferred) or toward the front of the quad if the leader's room is full. Leader beds will be marked with a reserved sign.
- 2. Leaders must use "Leader Only" Bathrooms, or arrange times for men to shower separate from boys.

- 3. Dorm residents are responsible for ensuring the showers, restrooms, and sleeping and common areas remain clean.
- 4. Thermostats must be kept at 70 degrees.

Campsites:

- 1. The district staff will approve all outpost campsite locations in accordance with the campsite policy.
- 2. Campers are responsible for ensuring the shower house and restrooms remain clean.
- 3. No nails or other like devices will be driven into live trees.
- 4. No standing trees may be cut down without district executive staff approval.
- 5. Females are only allowed in the Ranger camping area on Saturday between 9:30 am-8:00 pm

Health and Safety:

- 1. MEDICATION & FORMS
 - a. It is mandatory that all medications for anyone under the age of 18 be turned in to first aid upon arrival.
 - b. Parents must complete the medication form to accompany all medications (prescription, over the counter, allergy).
 - c. Please have parents place this form along with medications in a Ziplock bag. This must be turned in at registration. (Adult leaders may manage their own medication as long as it is kept secure and inaccessible to the boys). Please have parents give medications and completed forms to you as the main leader upon departure from the church rather than packing in luggage.
- 2. Leaders are always responsible for their groups. Each church should have a minimum of two leaders.
- 3. No adult should be alone with a boy at any time.
- 4. Shoes will be worn at all times except in the dorm, tents, or showers. NO FLIP FLOPS other than in showers.
- 5. No personal motorized vehicles (bikes, motorcycles, four-wheelers, scooters, golf carts, etc.) will be allowed at camp without approval.
- 6. Except for specified activity times, the lake is off-limits.
- 7. "Cut and Chop" cards are required for pocketknives. Boys should not bring large sheath knives.
- 8. Report any ant hills, bee or wasp nests to the staff.
- 9. All medical incidents must be reported to the nurse at the First Aid Station. This way we can make an accurate record of any medical situations, regardless of how minor they may be. Anyone suspected of having a serious injury such as a head, neck or back injury should not be moved. Send a third party immediately to the First Aid Station for emergency assistance. **No one** should be transported to the hospital without notification and approval of the KidMin Director.
- 10. All campers will be in their respective campsite/dorm from 12:00 am 6:00 am. Leaders know where your boys are at all times. No exceptions!

- 11. Everyone is required to attend all assemblies and services. Leaders are expected to assist at all altar calls.
- 12. To better ensure the safety of participants, games or activities in the campsite will be restricted to members of the outpost only. The district staff will be the approving authority for any game or campsite activity. Any activity deemed unsafe in the judgment of the staff (e.g. zip lines) will not be approved.
- 13. The farm and timber land adjacent to the campsite area is strictly off-limits. Be good neighbors.
- 14. Each commander and boy is expected to help keep the grounds clean and litter free. Trash should be taken to the dumpster as needed.
- 15. Electrical or extension cords running from campsites to power outlets vicinity of shower facilities are strictly prohibited.
- 16. Power generators are prohibited in campsites without District Director approval. All commanders requiring excess to electricity for medical purposes are highly encouraged to use the male dormitory.

CAMP TIMBERLAKE LAKE SLIDE RULES AND GUIDELINES

- 1. Timberlake personnel will turn on and off the slide.
- 2. Life jackets must be worn by anyone going down the slide.
- 3. Lifeguard must be present when using the slide.
- 4. Cannot wear cut offs or anything with rivets on clothing.
- 5. Do not wear bracelets, earrings, or necklaces while on the slide.
- 6. Only one rider at a time.
- 7. Only go down the slide feet first.
- 8. No jumping on the slide going down.
- 9. No stopping or changing positions while on the slide.

Store & Snack Shack

- a. Our store will be open in the cafeteria during all Saturday meals and activity times.
- b. Ranger concessions will be open Friday night, Saturday afternoon, and Saturday night after the council fire.
- c. Acceptable forms of payment
 - i. STORE- cash, check, or credit card (minimum \$5 for card)
 - ii. CONCESSIONS- cash only

FISHING

Fishing is permitted AND ENCOURAGED on Friday and Sunday! Enjoy, But it will not be permitted on Saturday as the lake will be used for many other activities.

Parking

This policy is necessary to protect all campers from injury:

- a. Always drive within the speed limit and in a safe manner. Please use sound judgment and common sense when operating a vehicle around pedestrians.
- b. All vehicles will receive a pass from Security upon entering the grounds. This pass must be displayed on the vehicle dash.
- c. Vehicles entering the campsite area will be given a time frame to unload equipment. Once unloaded, the operator will move the vehicle to one of the designated parking areas. Do not set up camp until all vehicles are moved.
- d. Vehicle operators are required to park within a marked spot in the parking area to allow room for other campers. This may require disconnecting trailers.
- e. No one may ride on the outside of a vehicle or in the bed of any truck.
- f. Persons with limited mobility should contact the district staff prior to camp. Vehicles will not be used for transport on campgrounds during camp.

Exit Procedure

Break down campsite first. Security will not allow vehicles to enter the camping area until all equipment is broken down and ready to load.

Campsite will be policed; no trash or structures are to be left on site. Outposts will remove and take trash to the dumpsters prior to departure.

Notify the campsite exit coordinator of intent to depart and request site/dorm area inspection.
